Recognize how the philosophy of multi-casualty incident (MCI) triage differs from that of our daily non-disaster triage. Describe the circumstances under which MCI triage may be implemented and the performance criteria to be accomplished at each stage. Review JumpSTART, SALT, and triage algorithms. Apply the JumpSTART triage algorithm to a simulated pediatric victim.

Discuss psychosocial barriers to effective implementation of MCI triage for the pediatric victim.

### 11:15 After the Injury: Assessing pediatric traumatic stress and providing support to patients
