- A LOT TO FOCUS ON as a NURSE
- Maximize patient experience, improve quality metrics, represent hospital brand, be mindful of costs, attract/retain top clinicians, create centers of excellence, improve productivity, continue to adapt to change, improve care coordination, standardize care protocols
- Improve financial help of organizations, enhance patient experience, build staff engagement, strengthen quality outcomes, increase operational efficiencies
- OR & CATH LAB are more similar than different!
- Focus on quality outcomes, you have to make patient feel safe/comfortable, early risers, high pressure/high intensity environment, extremely focused, ultimate multitasker, no room for laziness, variety of personalities, ability to adapt to change, continuous education, HERDERS! We have to rope up everyone
- CATH LAB ORIGIN – Spark of Inspiration
- Dr. Seldinger inspired catheterization. Dr Werner Forssmann self heart cath in Berlin. Dr. Melvin Judkins developed curve style caths. Dr Andreas Greuntzig first PCTA.
- 1977 first coronary balloon angioplasty, 1994 implantation of stent is superior to balloon angioplasty, 1996 use of aspirin and plavix to prevent thrombosis, 1999 intra-stent restenosis with brachytherapy
- INTERVENTIONAL PROCEDURE
- 1) Gain arterial access 2) insert sheath 3) insert guide catheter and engage to R or L side of heart 4) use guide wire to cross lesion 5) thread balloon onto guide wire 6) inflate balloon cath to desired pressure 7) remove balloon 8) insert stent 9)

- TYPES OF STENTS
- DES (drug eluting stent) – stent, balloon delivery stent, drug on stent, polymer – use DES to prevent thrombosis
- They now have stents with bio absorbable polymers – heal faster = lower risk of stent thrombosis
- FUTURE OF CATH LAB AND OR – possibly will be merging together!
