Connecting with our Mission: Why Hospice? Keynote Speaker Janet Paschal



Janet Paschal's career is marked by honors and accolades. With more than twenty recordings to her credit, Janet's passion and vulnerability are most evident in her inspiring music, including her latest release, Beginnings. Her recordings have been recognized with numerous Grammy and Dove Award nominations, and she is consistently named among Gospel Music's favorite soloists by the genre's top trade magazines.

A native of Reidsville, North Carolina, Janet was invited to join the gospel singing family, The LeFevres. The group changed its name to The Rex Nelon Singers. From there she became a member of televangelist Jimmy Swaggart's Crusade Team.

In 1986, Paschal began her solo career, sharing the stage with presidents and featured on the Gaither Homecoming Tour. She composed songs such as Another Soldier's Coming Home, God

Will Make A Way, and If I'd Had My Way, which found broad audiences in multiple music genres.

After battling breast cancer in 2005, Janet resumed her touring schedule, including concerts, women's conferences, and cancer awareness events. In November, 2008, the popular singer released a brand new book, Treasures of the Snow, which chronicles her triumphant battle with cancer as well as stories from three decades in Gospel music. Her first literary work, The Good Road, became a best seller.

In 2007 Janet volunteered with Comfort Care Hospice to visit patients and communities in the Tuscaloosa and Birmingham areas affected by devastating F5 tornados. Using her gifts of love, compassion and music she brought comfort and hope to patients and families.

In 2017, Janet realized a lifelong dream when she earned a Master's degree with honors in Accounting from the University of North Carolina, Greensboro, as well as induction into the University's Beta Gamma Sigma Chapter, the most prestigious international society for college business schools. This was a "bucket list", she states.

Most recently. Janet has released her third edition of her book, Treasures of the Snow, finding broad success in both Christian and secular markets.

Michael D. Barnett, MD, MS, FAAP, FAAHPM Assistant Professor Medicine & Pediatrics

Director, Palliative Medicine Fellowship Program Dr. Barnett was born in Paducah, Kentucky but moved to Virginia as a child. He graduated with a degree in Engineering Science and Biomedical Engineering from the University of Virginia in 2002. While living in central Russia during college, Dr. Barnett decided to pursue medicine rather than engineering, and after graduation moved back to Kentucky for medical school at the University of Kentucky.

In 2006, Dr. Barnett came to UAB for residency training in combined Internal Medicine & Pediatrics. He completed a year as Chief Resident of Med-Peds in 2010 before moving to Pittsburgh for fellowship training in Hospice & Palliative Medicine at UPMC. He stayed on another year to complete a Masters in Medical Education from the University of Pittsburgh.

Dr. Barnett moved back to Birmingham in 2012 and joined the faculty at the UAB Center for Palliative & Supportive Care.



Sam Perna, DO Assistant Professor Medical Director, Palliative and Supportive Care, Childrens of Alabama

Sam Perna, D.O., was born in West Virginia. He moved to Alabama as an adolescent and attended Tuscaloosa County High School graduating in 1987. He then attended the University of Alabama and received his undergraduate degree in Psychology with a minor in English in 1991. He continued at the University of Alabama and received his Master's degree in Counseling in 1995.

In 2003 Perna entered the Kansas City School of Medicine and Biosciences and graduated in 2003. Dr. Perna then served an internship and residency in Family Medicine at Broward General Medical Center in Ft. Lauderdale, FL from 2003 to 2006. Following residency, he entered private practice in Family Medicine & Urgent Care in south Florida where he practiced until December of 2007.

Dr. Perna furthered his Post Doctoral education at UAB as a Palliative Medicine Fellow. Four days after his graduation from fellowship, Dr. Perna joined the Center for Palliative Care at UAB in January of 2009 as Assistant Professor. Wendy Walters has been a clinical social worker for almost 30 years, spending her entire career working with patients and families facing end-of-life care. After a long career in hospice, Wendy has served for the last 9 years as the Family Support Coordinator for UAB Hospital, the 3rd largest public hospital in the country, working with dying patients and their families in the intensive care unit setting.

Wendy co-chairs UAB's Schwartz Center Rounds and the Psychosocial & Spiritual Grand Rounds. Wendy also is Vice Chair of UAB's Ethics Committee and hosts a monthly ethics case study conference. She teaches frequently within UAB, the community, and nationally, and is a frequent presenter at AOSW conferences. Wendy developed the first hospice SIG for AOSW and has served on the board. She has several published articles and is a book chapter author in a major palliative care social work textbook.
