

The History of Nursing Archives at the Howard Gotlieb Archival Research Center at Boston University is a leader in the preservation of Nursing History. We hold the personal and professional papers of nursing leaders, records of several schools of nursing, public health and professional nursing organizations, histories of various American and foreign schools of nursing, including early textbooks; as well as a very extensive book collection. These manuscripts and books document the evolution of the profession and its contribution to the fields of public health, women's rights, and military history.

The Florence Nightingale Digitization Project began in 2014 as a collaborative effort to create a comprehensive web-based collection of digitized correspondence written by Florence Nightingale. Original partners in the Project were the Howard Gotlieb Archival Research Center at Boston University, and the Florence Nightingale Museum, Royal College of Nursing and the Wellcome Library, all in London. Additional organizations have joined, and the collaborative now has 20 international partners. The collection currently contains over 2,300 scanned letters or direct links to partners' websites, which are accessible to the public through this portal hosted by Boston University. We hope this portal will be a valuable tool to anyone interested in Florence Nightingale, or engaged in research on any of the topics encompassed in the collection. The goal is to help to share Florence Nightingale with the world. This webpage is a resource for students, scholars, and all those who respect and admire "The Lady with the Lamp." We welcome you to explore the remarkable legacy that Florence Nightingale has left for us in her prolific correspondence, in her own words.
