

Congratulations to SUNA's Winning Chapters!

Each year, SUNA recognizes two chapters for their outstanding achievements. These awards acknowledge a small chapter (50 or less members) and a large chapter (above 51 members) for their accomplishments throughout the year, including educational programs, membership growth, community involvement, and community programs promoting awareness and education of urology issues. When selecting the winning chapters each year, SUNA considers member participation in chapter activities, innovative ideas to promote industry and member support, and advancement of members to become certified by the Certification Board for Urologic Nursing and Associates (CBUNA).

This year's small chapter of the year is the **Syracuse Chapter** in New York. With 38 members (an increase from last year) and 4 members who are certified through CBUNA (also up from last year), the chapter offered four educational activities with 15 to 18 members in attendance. Chapter members serve on task forces and the SUNA Foundation. The chapter hosted a chapter fundraiser, participated in a ZERO Prostate Cancer Run/Walk, and donates to the SUNA Foundation Silent Auction each year. Chapter members also participated in *Warm Hands and Paws*, where they collected hats and gloves for local children in need and blankets and leashes for a dog rescue.

The Mississippi Valley Chapter was the 2018 large chapter of the year. The chapter has 170 members and 38 certified members. The chapter offered five educational meetings for a total of 10.0 contact hours. The chapter has a website and logo, and chapter members participated in numerous community activities, including a food drive and toilet paper donations, a ZERO Prostate Cancer Run/Walk, and a presentation on "Violence, Compassion, and the Brain." A chapter member received the Macfarlane Award from CBUNA for the highest score on the certification exam. Chapter members are active in US TOO monthly prostate support meetings and the US TOO walk. Members assist with the local Parkinson's support group and provided a table to promote SUNA at a wound care conference. Chapter members are active as SUNA leaders, SUNA Foundation members, conference presenters, and Urologic Nursing manuscript reviewers.

I want to express my sincerest gratitude for the generous scholarship to attend the 2018 uro**Logic** Conference in San Diego. The experience was extremely rewarding on many levels.

Networking with urology professionals and developing new friends and colleagues was a wonderful experience and will help me continue to grow and inspire me professionally. I learned valuable information

at all of the sessions I attended, and I plan to incorporate this information in my current practice as an ARNP in urology within the Veterans Administration (VA).

I am grateful to have learned new information about pre- and postop cystectomy patients. I am excited to contact the ARNP from the University of Michigan, who provided such an excellent presentation and agreed to share clinical pathways with me. I have been back to work for 4 days and have already implemented gum chewing on two open cases on postoperative day one. We have had an ongoing problem in recent months with postop ileus, and I look forward to seeing better outcomes using this helpful idea. I also am very impressed by all the research presented, which inspires me to implement a research project very soon.

Peyronie's disease has been frustrating for me as a practitioner because we really do not have any good treatments available for our VA patients. We have asked several times about Xiaflex® but for some reason have been told we cannot get it. However, now that I have the literature directly from the American Urological Association (AUA) guidelines to present to our pharmacy, I plan to present some strong proposals to finally be able to offer something to treat our patients with Peyronie's.

It was awesome to learn about the AUA advocacy page, and I am excited to share the AUA Consensus Statement on Advanced Practice Providers with all of our urology surgeons as many of them do not understand the many roles of the APP. Hopefully, we can incorporate many new competencies in our practice.

I truly enjoyed all the presentations, discussions, poster presentations, vendors, and exhibits. My favorite social hour was the wine and cheese event and presentation by Dr. Thomas Keane on prostate cancer. I thought I was completely up to date on that subject, but I still learned so much from his humorous and informative talk.

I look forward to seeing everyone next year in Orlando!

Urodynamics

We had a great SIG meeting at the 2018 uro**Logic** Conference in San Diego. We reviewed the topics and questions that have been shared in the forum over the last year. Of particular interest was the topic of supervision in urodynamics (UDS), so I thought it would be a good idea to provide some clarification. Medical assistants, LVNs, RNs, and APRNs are all qualified to perform UDS. UDS may be independently per-

formed by APRNs, regardless of state. If you work in a dependent practice state, meaning that a supervising physician is required for APRN practice and if there is not a supervising physician on site, the procedure will be billed under the APRN's NPI number. Medical assistants, LVNs, and RNs must have a provider on site somewhere when they are performing UDS in order to receive reimbursement for service. The procedure is billed under the supervising physician on site at the time UDS is performed. If it is a state where APRNs have full independent practice authority and are not required to have a supervising physician for their licensure, then they may provide on-site supervision of an MA, LVN, or RN performing UDS. However, if you work in a state that requires APRNs to have a supervising physician, then this may vary by state laws. Additionally, hospital organizations may have their own rules and regulations about who can perform UDS and who can supervise UDS. Make sure to check with your state and your organization on current policies.

Computer Testing Starts This Year!

CBUNA is offering computer-based testing for urologic certification starting in April 2019. Representatives at the CBUNA booth at the 2018 uro**Logic** Conference in San Diego received many questions from conference attendees regarding this new opportunity. Below is the information you need to successfully sign up and complete the exam.

Prior to the Exam

- Identify the best exam date for you. Testing will be offered during the months of April and September.
- Submit the application by the posted deadline. For April testing, the deadline is February 4. (If you submit your application during the period of February 5 to 19, a \$25 late fee will be added.) For September testing, the deadline is July 8. (If you submit your application during the period of July 9 to 23, a \$25 late fee will be added.)
- Upon approval of your examination application, you will receive an examination permit by email.
- The email permit will include a link to an online scheduling portal for you to schedule the exam at the computer-based testing location of choice.
- The computer-based testing agency will send a follow-up email to you confirming the exam site, date, and time that you have chosen.
- If you do not receive the examination permit by email at least 7 days prior to the testing month, notify C-NET at 800-463-0786.
- You will not be admitted to the examination without an examination permit and proper ID.

The Certification Exam

- The certification examinations are multiple-choice tests.
- 3 hours are allotted to complete the Certified Urologic Associate (CUA) and Certified Urologic Registered Nurse (CURN) examinations. These exams contain 150 questions.
- 4 hours are allotted to complete the Certified Urologic Nurse Practitioner (CUNP) examination. This exam contains 175 questions.
- Read each question carefully and choose the one answer that you think answers the question correctly.

- There is no penalty for guessing so an educated guess is appropriate if you are unsure of the answer.
- You can skip a question and return to it later.
- Upon completion of the examination, your score will be available immediately.
- If you passed the exam, the report will reflect your score as well as notify you of when to expect your certificate in the mail and when your name will appear in the online CBUNA Certified Directory.
- If you were unsuccessful on the exam, you will receive a report that reflects your score and includes a breakdown of the test subareas with the percent of questions you answered correct in each subarea. This breakdown of subarea scores will help you determine the areas in which you are weak and need further study.

Please note that the pen and paper examinations will still be offered during the uro**Logic** Conferences.

Finances. SUNA continues to be under the spending freeze that began in 2013. While the Board of Directors (BOD) examines our financial situation on a monthly basis, these past 2 years we have focused on our membership market, purposely concentrating our resources to areas that will improve our ability to promote strong educational programs as well as membership communication and growth. Treasurer Fran Foley has

done an excellent job in keeping the BOD aware of the financial impact of any and all decisions we have made so that finances are foremost in our minds. Fran presented the full budget report this year at the business meeting. This was Fran's final year on the Board. We thank her for her dedication and hard work. We welcome incoming

treasurer, Leanne Schimke, to the BOD.

Membership. SUNA has over 2,000 members. Through several surveys this year, we have a clear picture of our membership, which includes at least four generations: Mature/Silents (1927-1945), Baby Boomers (1946 1964), Generation X (1965-1980), and Millennials/Generation Y (1981-2000).

The BOD is committed to our members and has begun to examine not only how to gain new members but where new members may exist for future growth. Our Membership Task Force headed by Director-at-Large (DAL) Gina Powley has worked diligently this past year. Task force members included Glenn Sulley, Saundra Sturdy, Raquel Zamora, and Danielle Quallich. Through survey feedback, we have come to understand that our members want and expect return on their dues. The BOD has begun to implement changes in our online presence with revisions coming to our website and online forum. In 2019, we will launch Higher Logic, a more sophisticated communication platform that will allow memberwide discussions, dissemination of information, and quicker, easier exchange and engagement.

At our recent meeting in San Diego, certified medical assistants, registered medical assistants, medical technicians, medical assistants, and registered technicians requested networking opportunities, specific educational opportunities, and platforms for group discussion. The BOD has begun looking at ways to meet the needs of these important members of our medical team and our

Chapters. We continue to hold our chapter president calls, which support our chapter presidents as they grow their chapters and provide educational activities for their members. SUNA has 29 chapters, including the Florida Greater Orland Metro Chapter, which is currently in probation. The Nursing Network helped many of our chapters develop chapter websites for greater visibility.

Education. SUNA implemented a new educational program in 2018. The Advanced uroLogic Conference

was held in Philadelphia in April. As a new educational venture for our experienced RN and APP members, the conference was well received with rave reviews from our corporate sponsors who are already looking forward to the 2019 meeting in Chicago.

SUNA continues to offer monthly free CNE. During SUNA's conference in Las Vegas in 2016, members approached me to request online CE, free and available at their convenience. Our chapter presidents continue to request CE Fast Track programs for their chapter meetings.

Research. SUNA has research funds available for members. The BOD reviewed one research proposal this year. We would love to see more proposals submitted. Barbara Broome continues to serve as research liaison for SUNA. We are considering development of a Research Special Interest Group (SIG). Susanne Quallich presented on research at the 2018 uroLogic conference in San Di-

Collaboration. Heather Schultz and Christy Krieg serve on the American Urological Association (AUA) APP Education Committee. Heather is serving as chair of the AUA/APP Education Committee, and Christy Krieg is

serving as SUNA's representative.

In the past 2 years, AUA has asked SUNA to participate on the development of three White Papers on the Surgical Care of the Urologic Patient: Preoperative, Intraoperative, and Postoperative. Chris Tucci, Fran Foley, Glenda Wilkinson, and Charlene Vollmer contributed their expertise in the development of these papers. Michelle Lajiness and I served as reviewers. In addition, Mary Louise Lee worked with AUA on the update of the Joint AUA/SUNA White Paper on Reprocessing Cystoscopes. The White Papers are available on the SUNA and AUA websites.

Amy Hull has been working with the American Urogynecologic Society (AUGS) to develop a proposal on pessary guidelines. Both the AUGS and SUNA Boards have approved this collaboration. We will be moving forward on this project in the coming months. The SUNA BOD endorsed the AUGS document entitled A Training Guide - Core Competencies for the Advanced Practice Provider Entering Urogynecology. Access the document at www.augs.org/ app-training-guide.

Stefano Terzoni from the European Association of Urology Nurses (EAUN) attended SUNA's conference in Chicago in 2017. We discussed ways in which SUNA and

the EAUN can collaborate on several issues.

Amy Hull continues to work with the National Association For Continence (NAFC) to investigate ways in which we can collaborate. NAFC supports and endorses the NAFC Continence Care Award, which is presented annually at the uro**Logic** Conference. This year's winner was Darla Cleaves, BSN, RNFA, CURN, CNOR.

Sponsored by the AUA Urology Care Foundation, the Bladder Health Alliance is a coalition of 30 patient and physician advocacy organizations, including SUNA, that work to advance awareness and education about bladder health. I was fortunate to attend the Alliance's meeting. In 2016, the Alliance was successful in proclaiming November as Bladder Health Month and securing House and Senate resolutions that support the designation of November as "National Bladder Health Month" in the United States.

Susanne Quallich participated in the AUA Annual Urology Advocacy Summit in Washington, DC, in February 2018. She presented "How to Better Utilize APPs in Urology," a topic requested by the Advocacy Committee. Susanne will represent SUNA at the Summit this year as well.

Legislation. Mary Meskel retired from her position as SUNA legislative liaison. SUNA is a member of the Nursing Community Coalition.

Publications. Susanne Quallich, *Urologic Nursing* Editor, has been busy since her appointment. Her primary efforts have revolved around recruiting members for the editorial board and authors for journal articles as well as pursuing collaboration with national and international urologic nursing associations. MiChelle McGarry was appointed to the Editorial Board in July 2018, replacing Kay Gaines who retired.

Glenda Wilkinson continues to do a fabulous job on the *Uro-Gram*. She recently retired from her position as a nurse educator with Olympus.

SUNA has sold approximately 650 copies of the *Core Curriculum for Urologic Nursing* since its publication. We contracted with Rittenhouse Book Distributors in 2017 as another outlet for selling the *Core Curriculum*. Copies have been sold at the AUA and International Continence Society conferences the past 2 years. We also are looking at new ways to promote sales of the *Core Curriculum*.

2018 marked the 5-year revision for the *Scope and Standards of Practice for Urologic Nursing*. A task force headed by Barbara Broome is working to complete the update. The *Scope and Standards* were added to SUNA's Strategic Plan in an effort to keep the 5-year cycle on the minds of Board members so that a task force can be formed well in advance of the revision deadline. SUNA will be publishing a new edition of the *Scope and Standards* in the coming months. This resource is important for many reasons, including accountability for practice and standards that improve patient care

SUNA is in the process of revising Patient Education Fact Sheets as well as updating/adding or removing some of our Clinical Practice Guidelines. DAL Glenn Sulley has been appointed to lead the task force responsible for updating Fact Sheets. DAL Katie Wall is working with several members to complete the Clinical Practice Guidelines. A task force will review the fact sheets and practice guidelines once they are revised. When completed, SUNA will explore various translations for these documents.

It has been a great honor to serve as SUNA President for the past 2 years. Our organization is moving in an exciting and new direction. As Past President, there are several initiatives I will continue to pursue. Please continue to reach out to me or other Board members with your concerns or questions. I hope to see all of you at the 2019 uro**Logic** Conference as we celebrate SUNA's 50th anniversary! Start planning now to attend this very special event.

The SUNA BOD has accomplished numerous tasks and initiated efforts for newly identified areas of growth. Following is a snapshot of some of the key areas of focus:

• AUGS Collaboration. SUNA participated in numerous calls with the CEO and publications director of AUGS. These discussions revealed potential for collaboration, specifically in the area of nonsurgical management. We will begin with

evaluation and documentation of pessary practices. While this effort is still in the planning stages, we have determined a need for a practice guideline. However, we are determining if a white paper or systematic review is needed first.

- Efforts to determine areas for collaboration with NAFC have stalled, and we will need to re-evaluate. Past discussions have centered on translation assistance for the Patient Education Fact Sheets. However, before this can be completed, updates must be completed to the current English language fact sheets. DAL Glenn Sulley is spearheading efforts to create a task force to update these important documents. NAFC/SUNA collaboration will remain an ongoing priority for the BOD for the upcoming year.
- We are nearing completion of a new edition of *Urologic Nursing: Scopes and Standards of Practice*. Final edits are ongoing with full review by the American Nurses Association to be completed soon.
- DAL Katie Wall continues to work with past authors of SUNA's Clinical Practice Guidelines for updates and revisions to these resources.
- There are ongoing efforts to determine how the SIGs can be reorganized, renamed, etc. The goal of this effort is to generate greater traffic and online networking among SUNA members with a planned roll out of a new online forum. Recent discussions with SIG leaders have been productive. Suggestions for current and future engagement efforts include a "Urologic Question of the Month" as well as SIG leader perusal of the journal for topics to encourage discussion in the forums.
- Efforts to increase the visibility of the *Urologic Nursing* journal are ongoing with identified areas for potential growth. Continued collaborative efforts with the British Association of Urological Nurses (BAUN), EAUN, and other international urologic nursing organizations may prove helpful for both organizational and journal visibility. Another area for consideration includes the option for an online offering.
- I had a wonderful time working with the DALs and chapter presidents. Bimonthly chapter leadership calls were well attended this year. Discussion topics were timely and in-depth. Efforts to engage SUNA




chapters are ongoing, and we will continue to explore areas for growth, collaboration, and education.
