The PA Asthma Partnership is offering a free Facilitator Training & Certification for the American Lung Association's signature program, Open Airways For Schools®.

Why Open Airways For Schools?

Open Airways For Schools (OAS) is a school- based curriculum that educates and empowers kids through a fun and interactive approach to asthma self-management. OAS is a recommended component of the American Lung Association's Asthma-Friendly Schools Initiative, a comprehensive approach to managing asthma in schools. It is also the most widely recognized asthma management program for children in the nation, and a proven-effective way to improve asthma self-management skills, decrease asthma emergencies and raise asthma awareness among families and school personnel.

Who are we looking for?

An Open Airways For Schools facilitator can be a school nurse or other staff member, a community asthma educator or a volunteer who likes working with children. Some knowledge and experience with asthma is preferred, but not required.

An Open Airways For Schools Certified Facilitator is a person who:

- · Wants to help children learn how to control their asthma
- Can relate to children, offer support for their concerns and refer them for any extra help they may need
- · Helps children participating in Open Airways For Schools improve their quality of life

What does this Scholarship include?

The Open Airways For Schools Facilitator Training, Materials & Certification is valued at \$175 and will be provided free of cost.

By becoming an Open Airways For Schools Facilitator, you get to:

 - a. The Lung Action Network addresses such topics as lung cancer, tobacco use, air pollution, lung disease research, and improved access to health care.
- 4. Air Quality School Flag Program Materials
 - a. Only provided upon successful completion of the Facilitator Training
 - b. The Air Quality Flag Program alerts organizations to the local air quality forecast and helps them to take actions to protect people's health, including those with asthma.
