- Research and Outcomes Assessment in Hospice and Palliative Care
- Advanced Team-Based Palliative Care
- All students take first four core courses, results in award of a Graduate Certificate.
- Students select four electives. If student takes all four courses in a given track, results in a second Graduate Certificate.
 Electives can be taken across tracks as desired.
- All students take the last two required core courses.
- All semesters are eight weeks long: two eight week semesters in the "Fall semester," two eight week semesters in the "Spring semester," and one eight week semester in the "Summer semester."
