



DRIVING DIRECTIONS TO Westminster Hotel



FROM MANHATTAN:

Take the Lincoln Tunnel to 495 (New Jersey Turnpike South) to Exit 15W (280 West). Take 280 West to Exit 4A (Eisenhower Parkway South) to the Route 10 Circle. At the circle turn right onto Route 10 West (W. Mt. Pleasant Ave.). Travel for 1/4 mile, and the Westminster Hotel is located on the right hand side at 550 W. Mt. Pleasant Ave.

FROM GEORGE WASHINGTON BRIDGE/NORTH:

Take the New Jersey Turnpike South to Exit 15W (280 West). Take 280 West to Exit 4A (Eisenhower Parkway South) to the Route 10 Circle. At the circle turn right on to Route 10 West (W.Mt. Pleasant Ave.). Travel for 1/4 mile, and the Westminster Hotel is located on the righthand side at 550 W.Mt. Pleasant Ave.

FROM CENTRAL AND SOUTHERN NEW JERSEY AND NEWARK INTERNATIONAL LIBERTY AIRPORT:

Take the New Jersey Turnpike North to Exit 15W (280 West). Take 280 West to Exit 4A (Eisenhower Parkway South) to the Route 10 Circle. At the circle turn right onto Route 10 West (W.Mt. Pleasant Ave.). Travel for 1/4 mile, and the Westminster Hotel is located on the righthand side at 550 W.Mt. Pleasant Ave.

FROM 287 NORTH OR SOUTH: Take Exit 39 to Route 10 East. Proceed onto the Walnut Street jughandle. Turn left onto Route 10 West (W.Mt. Pleasant Avenue). Turn into right lane, and the Westminster Hotel is located on the righthand side at 550 W.Mt. Pleasant Ave.

FROM WESTERN NEW JERSEY AND PENNSYLVANIA: Take 80 East to Parsippany. Follow signs to 280 East. Take 280 East to Exit 4A (Eisenhower Parkway South) to the Route 10 Circle. At the circle turn right onto Route 10 West (W.Mt. Pleasant Ave.). Travel for 1/4 mile, and the Westminster Hotel is located on the right hand side at 550 W. Mt. Pleasant Ave.

From I-287

Traveling North – take Exit 39, traveling south – take Exit 39A. Follow Route 10 East (toward Whippany) for 3 miles. After passing Novartis, make first U-turn at Loews Theater for Route 10 West. Ramada Drive will be on right.

From Garden State Parkway

Take Exit 145 to I-280 West. Travel about 7 miles and take Exit 4A onto Eisenhower Parkway South. At 5th traffic light, turn right onto Route 10 West. Travel 3 miles and Ramada Drive will be on right.

From I-80 (and George Washington Bridge via I-80 West)

Take Exit 43 to I-287 South. Travel 3 miles and take Exit 39A. Follow Route 10 East (toward Whippany) for 3 miles. After passing Novartis, make first U-turn at Loews Theater for Route 10 West. Ramada Drive will be on right.

From N.J. Turnpike (and Lincoln Tunnel via Turnpike South or Holland Tunnel via Turnpike North)

Take Exit 15W to I-280 West. Travel about 13 miles and take Exit 4A onto Eisenhower Parkway South. At 5th traffic light, turn right onto Route 10 West. Travel 3 miles and Ramada Drive will be on right.

From New York Thruway (and Tappan Zee Bridge via I-287 West)

Take Exit 14 to I-287 South/New Jersey. Travel about 25 miles and take Exit 39A. Follow Route 10 East (toward Whippany) for 3 miles. After passing Novartis, make first U-turn at Loews Theater for Route 10 West. Ramada Drive will be on right.

From Newark Liberty International Airport

Follow signs for I-78 West (Local) for 5 miles and exit onto Route 24 West. After 10 miles take I-287 North for 3 miles – then take Exit 39. Follow Route 10 East (toward Whippany) for 3 miles. After passing Novartis, make first U-turn at Loews. Thereafter for Route 10 West. Ramada Drive will be on right.
