

# **Course Description**

This two day intense critical care review course is intended for nurses who are planning to take the AACN-CCRN, CCRN/E, CCRN/K or AACN-PCCN,

PCCN/K certification exam or as a clinical practice review seminar. The lectures and time allotment are based on the exam blueprints and will cover all body systems, physiology, pathophysiology, assessment strategies and treatment options for medical and surgical critically ill patients. This course will benefit those who have critical and /or progressive care experience and need/want a clinical update and of latest best practice and those who have studied and need/want a final review prior to taking the CCRN/PCCN certification exam. This seminar is not intended as a critical care course and is recommended for nurses with at least one year of critical or progressive care experience.

She has published widely in the nursing literature, including eight book chapters in major critical care nursing texts and multiple journal articles. She currently serves on the editorial board of AACN Advanced Critical Care and was the founding editor of the Certification Prep Column Editor for Critical Care Nurse.
