A recipient of two Fulbright Awards, she established the WHO Collaborating Center in Geriatric Nursing Education at Rory Meyers College of Nursing, New York University in 2004. She is the founding editor of the Journal of Addictions Nursing, and received HRSA funding for five curriculum and faculty development projects. As a member of nursing and inter-professional organizations she has written and advocated for substance use policies, the specialty of addictions nursing and policies on impaired nursing practice. In addition to her emerita title at the Meyers College of Nursing, NYU she is a psychotherapist in private practice in New York City and consults globally on mental health issues.



Deborah Koivula RN, BSN, CARN

Ms. Koivula is a Registered Nurse and Eastern Regional Coordinator for the Statewide Peer Assistance for Nurses (SPAN) program in New York State. She is an advocate for nurses personally impacted by the disease of addiction and supports their personal as well as professional recovery. Ms. Koivula assists nurses in navigating the complexities of licensure, legal consequence, treatment and employment related issues while dually protecting public safety interests. Through her compassionate approach, she helps nurses improve their professional practice management through integration of recovery planning, prioritizing self-care, and establishing a peer network.



Kristin Waite-Labott, RN, BSN, CARN

Kristin has been an RN since 1991. After losing much to alcohol and drug addiction, she turned her life around. She now works as a behavioral health nurse, has published a book about her story of recovery called "An Unlikely Addict", writes a blog on issues surrounding addiction and works with others who struggle with addiction. She accomplishes this by presenting to nursing students at colleges and universities around the country, by speaking at nursing conferences, and by being an active participant in IntNSA (International Nurses Society on Addictions) including serving as president of the Eastern Wisconsin IntNSA chapter.
