

#### **GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS NEWSLETTER ARTICLE. 3-15-22**

Often, I find myself curious and searching the web for events and information on what is 'governmentally' happening in our state. Here are some important events up and coming.

Voter registration deadlines for the August 9<sup>th</sup> Partisan Primary are coming up. There are several options and it is easy to do; online, by mail, or in person. <a href="www.myvote.wi.gov">www.myvote.wi.gov</a> is an excellent resource to discover what is on the ballot in your area and general election information.

The 2022 Wisconsin fall general election is scheduled in the <u>U.S. state</u> of <u>Wisconsin</u> for November 8, 2022. All of Wisconsin's partisan executive and administrative offices are up for election, as well as one of Wisconsin's <u>U.S. Senate</u> seats, <u>Wisconsin's eight seats</u> in the <u>United States House of Representatives</u>, the seventeen odd-numbered seats in the <u>Wisconsin State Senate</u>, and all 99 seats in the <u>Wisconsin State Assembly</u>. The 2022 Wisconsin fall primary is scheduled for August 9, 2022. The candidate registration deadline for the 2022 Fall election was June 1, 2022.

Incumbent Republican Ron Johnson will seek reelection to a third six-year term in 2022. Eight Democrats have so far registered to run in the election: Mandela Barnes, Gillian Battino, Chantia Lewis, Sarah Godlewski, Alex Lasry, Adam Murphy, Tom Nelson, and Peter Peckarsky.

Please take 5 minutes to check things out. There is a good chance you will find some interesting information that may lead you down another investigative nursing pathway!

Answer: The Nurses' Responsibility in the Perianesthesia Setting is to assure the patient or legal representative has sufficient knowledge to make a knowledgeable decision of the procedure provided by the provider and can witness the signature on the consent form. The basic elements of an informed consent include:

Patient must know he has a role in making decision

The proposed treatment or procedure

Who will be preforming the procedure

Discussion of risks, benefits and alternatives, Discussion of Pros and Cons of each

Discussion of any medical uncertainty

Assessment of patient's understanding of the treatment plan

Exploration of patient preference

No Coercion

Must respect patient Autonomy

Hospitals and other facilities should utilize risk management measures such as the following to address informed consent:

Have a written policy that describes: what treatment and procedures require informed consent

The hospital's policy will be in compliance with Joint Commission, CMS, and other applicable guidelines or requirements.

Simplify the content, language, and length of informed consent documents and patient educational material.

Educate providers that informed consent is a process of effective communication between the provider and the patient, not just a signature on a form

#### **2022 ASPAN Conference**

For me the 41st national ASPAN conference was a surreal experience. I have never attended something like that that had so many people with shared interests, shared backgrounds from education to values, and a passion for quality improvement. The sheer amount of knowledge to gain at your fingertips at an event like this was awe inspiring. I also wanted to point out it was so much more than just simply attending the classes, which were in amongst themselves so powerfully educational, there was also so much to learn from the posters, the vendors, and fellow nurses from across the country and how the perform their duties and have solved problems unique within the peri-operative setting.

One of the things I wanted to touch base on was a poster I noticed. It had to do with creating a float pool within the perioperative areas themselves. This is especially relevant as we are clearly within the full swing of the nursing shortage, and it seemed like a great way to assist with this problem. The concept is to create a team of RN's who are capable of floating to Pre-op, Short Stay and PACU. The incentives are, no call, no weekends and no holidays. The benefits are very self-evident, you create a team that helps to prevent shortage on units. The nurse is assigned to a unit per the schedule, but everyone is flexible so if a unit turns out short, due to say sick calls, the nurse would be willing to switch to go to the shorted unit. Furthermore a nurse on this unit could even float for a certain number of hours to help cover lunches etc. All of this showed an increase in staff satisfaction, and healthier patient outcomes.

Another two Posters I found extremely fascinating were the text message communication posters. I found two of those, one was pediatric specific, and the other was for all patient populations. This messaging sent continuous updates via text message to chosen family members. The updates included incisions, anesthesia start, headed to recovery, among many other updates. The advantages of this were decreased anxiety among family members, more thorough communication, and limiting the strain on nurses so they could focus more on the patient themselves. As someone who recently had a pediatric patient who was having respiratory failure, while also attempting to make sure the patient's mother was constantly updated, this would have been extremely helpful in this situation, both in staffing needs as well as helping the parent understand we were doing everything possible as fast as possible.


The classes themselves were also amazing, all of them were but I would specifically like to talk about the

COVID-19 update. I was expecting very little education on this subject, however I was pleasantly surprised. The presenters were simply amazing, and they helped me to understand more evidence based practices in regards to this subject. They spoke to the fact that this is going to be our new reality, and we are going to have to learn to live with it. While there may be ebbs and flows with the number of cases and or severity of strains, us having to learn to live with a constant threat of pandemic is simply our new reality. This is not to say we should have no hope, but instead that we should make sure to stay vigilant, educated, safe, but resume our lives as normally as possible. 
and don't miss out on opportunities like an ASAPN conference due to the threat of a pandemic.


#### White House outlines plan to distribute pediatric vaccines

#### Government Affairs Continued:

The White House has outlined plans to distribute low-dose COVID-19 vaccines for use in children ages 6 months to 5 years, the last major demographic to get access to a vaccine. Although the Moderna and Pfizer/BioNTech vaccines are still in the final approval process, 5 million doses were released by the administration June 3, when providers were allowed to begin pre-ordering, another 5 million will be released by June 21, and millions more will be available later. Pharmacies, pediatricians, primary care clinicians, clinics and other sites will administer the shots at no cost.



attendance at the ASPAN National Conference helped to reaffirm the type of care, workflows, and importance of the care provided in our organization by perianesthesia staff.






## Rhiannon A Gatton – RN/BSN : Editor Message To Readers
