Virtual Reality in the Perioperative Setting

Virtual Reality (VR) is a computer-based technology that simulates experiences in an artificial environment. VR immerses the user by providing three-dimensional images on a screen, and allows the user to interact with the virtual environment. This technology trend is being used in multiple fields, from gaming, tourism, construction and design, to education and healthcare.

In healthcare, VR has been studied as an intervention for managing chronic pain and anxiety with some promising results. A research article published in 2020 in the *Journal of Clinical Medicine* analyzes the benefits of utilizing VR in the perioperative setting to reduce preoperative anxiety. Up to 80% of patients having surgery experience preoperative anxiety due to fear of pain or complications. Use of VR prior to surgery showed a significant reduction in patient anxiety scores when compared to the control group, in particular with the pediatric population. 

Fall 2022 Report

Legislation-CO

- HB 22-1298- license fee relief-PASSED and EFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY
- HB 22-1041- healthcare workers can request to have their personal information removed from government websites after receiving threats to their safety-PASSED
- HB 22-1401-hospitals must, as of 9/1/22, establish staffing planning committee comprised of at least 60% staff nurses.
- SB 22-226-Programs to support Healthcare Work Force
 - Created healthcare workforce resilience and retention program
 - Establish grant program for nursing students and healthcare professional students enrolled in accredited schools to complete degree requirements.
- HB 22-1240-creates the mandatory reporter task force (task force). The purpose of the task force is to analyze best practices and recommend changes to training materials and reporting procedures for people required by law to report child abuse or neglect.

Work place violence legislation is gaining steam at the federal level. Passed by the House (HB 1195) on 4/16/21 (D-CT) and reintroduced 6/7/22 to the Senate (Tammy Baldwin, D-WI)

SB 003-Community colleges to offer an LPN->BSN program.

The lyrics of Bob Dylan's song seems appropriately applied to the last few years of RMPANA's legacy. Just as our world and country is facing many challenges, so has RMPANA. Losing one of our inspirational founding leaders and a good friend along with many changes in our organizational structure has rocked many of our members. But we are a strong organization, and we will endure and move forward with the changing times!

Welcome and a hearty thank you to Maria Sekutera for accepting the chairmanship of this committee. I will be mentoring her through this next year.

The following are updates on organizational and policy changes from the fall board of directors meeting.

District 1 voted to dissolve, leaving no District organizations in Colorado. The Component will function solely as RMPANA. Policies, Job Descriptions, Orientation checklists and forms will be revised by the end of year to reflect these changes.

All scholarships will also be reviewed, revised, or updated in the next few months.

The policy for the National Conference Scholarship was changed regarding the submission date to say: "Submission of the scholarship will be open January 1st until four weeks before the conference start date. The selection of the candidate will be on a first come first serve basis for eligible applicants."

The board voted to re-name the winter workshop "The Lois Schick Winter Workshop" as a tribute to Lois honoring her passion for education. This was an annual workshop held by District I each February.

The board voted to increase the board meetings to quarterly from previous biannual meetings with dates and times to be determined by the board.

The board voted to appoint a co-chairman of the education committee from the previous District 1 membership to continue the traditions and standards set by District 1 education committee.

The board approved creating a new policy on establishing a RMPANA member representative for hospitals/facilities. The role will be defined and benefits to include points for clinical ladder, more involvement with RMPANA with minimal commitment, and a one day paid registration for an educational event.

The board established a committee to complete and apply for the Gold Leaf award in 2023.

The board voted to increase the budget in 2023 to utilize the hosting facility's AV team to provide an improved virtual option for educational offerings.

The president and past president will explore establishing a RMPANA Zoom account allowing the board opportunities to connect with each other and membership.

The board agreed to increase the budget for 2023 to provide more opportunities for RMPANA leaders to attend the National Conference and ASPAN's Professional Development Institute.

The board voted to pay the registration fee to National Conference for all officers and committee chairmen for the Denver event in 2023. In addition, there will be multiple <u>active</u> member scholarships available for one day registration fee. Watch for more to come on that!

Reminder that member scholarships for this year are due December 31st.

RMPANA COOKBOOK......

Here's another comfort recipe to try!!

Great for the cool fall nights.

Barb Godden was RMPANA's 9th President and continues to be active today. Barb has is currently to editor of the ASPAN Breathline newsletter.

BEEF STROGANOFF

- 1 lb. beef tenderloin or sirloin steak (about ½-inch thick) or can substitute 1 lb. hamburger
- 2 Thsp. butter or margarine
- ½ lb. mushrooms, washed, trimmed and sliced
- 1 medium onion, minced (about ½ c.)

- 1 (10 ½ oz.) can beef broth
- 2 Tosp. catsup garlic salt or powder
- 1 tsp. salt
- 3 Tbsp. flour
- 1 c. dairy sour cream
- 3 to 4 c. hot cooked noodles

Cut meat across grain into ½-inch strips, about 1½-inches long. Cook until light brown (or brown hamburger if using instead). Melt butter in another large pan. Add mushrooms and onion. Cook and stir until onion is tender. Reserving ⅓ cup of the broth, stir in remaining broth, the catsup, garlic and salt. Cover. Simmer 15 minutes. Blend reserved broth and flour. Stir into onion and mushroom mixture. Add meat. Heat to boiling, stirring constantly. Boil and stir 1 minute. Reduce heat. Stir in sour cream. Heat. Serve over cooked noodles.
