WHEREAS, the perianesthesia nurses of this country strive to advance nursing practice through education, research and standards: and

WHEREAS; we recognize that as the American population ages, advances in medicine raise life expectancies, and home healthcare services expand, the demand for perianesthesia nurses will only increase, and that the value of the services and care they provide will remain an integral part of the American healthcare system; and

WHEREAS, this week, the state of Colorado joins ASPAN and the Rocky Mountain PeriAnesthesia Nurses Association in recognizing perianesthesia nurses throughout our state for their steadfast commitment to patient care and the continued advancement of nursing practices;
