

Treasury Report

RMPANA has been fortunate to have a strong cash reserve. As of Feb 1, 2023 our treasury has \$153,959.80. Our goal is to have 2 years of operating funds available per ASPAN guidance. Our 2023 budget includes an unusually large number of ASPAN National Conference scholarships as the conference will be held in Denver. In addition to the \$5000 in scholarships RMPANA normally budgets for conference, this year we awarded \$30,000 in \$500 national conference scholarships to be used for tuition and hotel expenses. These funds came from the District 1 treasury of RMPANA which included the Denver area. The district dissolved in 2022 with the stated desire of the District 1 board to use the funds for educational scholarships. We had an amazing response, and these were awarded in approximately 2 weeks.

Additional scholarships are available for a new nurse scholarship for nursing students, an advanced practice scholarship for nurses pursuing additional education, and a charitable scholarship. Criteria for these are on the rmpana.org website.

Governmental Affairs

The Proclamation for Perianesthesia Nurses Week was signed by Colorado Governor, Jared Polis, and posted on the RMPANA website. Nurses Day at the Capitol was hosted by Colorado Nurses Association

Meet and greet with Colorado Senate member Kyle Mullica, an active Colorado Nurse was attended. Mr. Mullica has introduced a bill that encourages each public school in Colorado to provide instruction on CPR and the use of AED's to students in grades 9 through 12

The annual Professional Development Institute, held in Kansas City in November, presented a session regarding advocacy. It was attended by Chanda Hassemer, Janet Lopez and Krista Hall

Workplace violence continues to be hot topic for nurses and for our advocacy groups. ASPAN will have host an Advocacy webinar in the near future.

Evidence-Based Practice

1st annual Lois Schick Memorial Winter Workshop

On February 11th, RMPANA hosted an informative conference with topics such as an innovative Prehabilitation clinic in Northern Colorado that helps to optimize patients prior to surgery and improve surgical outcomes, the latest in urology including how advances and changes in practice have led to improved outcomes with fewer side effects, and a talk by past ASPAN President and RMPANA member, Regina Hoefner-Notz, on how we can all be leaders in our profession regardless of our individual roles.

Multimodal analgesia was another great topic presented by Michael Jones, DNP, CRNA, who is a local anesthesia provider. Dr.Jones was very knowledgeable on regional anesthesia, and encouraged us to advocate for blocks for our patients when appropriate. He also discussed how research has determined 15mg of IV ketorolac is just as effective as 30mg, with less risk of side effects. I also enjoyed the discussion on the risks of midazolam use in the elderly, and the possibility it contributes to postoperative cognitive dysfunction.



The ASPAN National Conference begins on Wednesday April 26 with the Board of Director meeting for ASPAN. Anyone is welcome to attend this meeting. Also on Wednesday we, as the hosting component, will set up stations for hospitality to welcome and introduce attendees to Denver area attractions and activities.

Thursday is the Representative Assembly which is an all day meeting of ASPAN and nation wide component leaders who discuss and decide ASPAN's future. While members of the Representative Assembly are required to attend, all are welcome to join. Thursday evening is a gathering time to meet old and new friends called "the Happening".
