Another highlight, RMPANA received the Shining Star award for supporting and encouraging CPAN and CAPA certification within our component.

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Next up, our annual Retreat in the Rockies, held in Breckenridge on October 7th. We couldn't have asked for a more beautiful setting to learn and socialize with other perianesthesia nurses. Thanks to all who presented and attended! Treasurer's Update Sana Zamirripa

Happy Fall! RMPANA continues to be in a strong position financially. The RMPANA Board of Directors elected to grant an unprecedented number of scholarships this year, as we held the ASPAN National Conference in Denver. 66 of the 70 scholarships that were awarded have been claimed. We have also awarded \$1200 of the budgeted \$4500 for member scholarships. We accumulated excess funds during the pandemic and have taken the opportunity to advance our perioperative education mission to meet ASPAN's and our goal of having 2 years' operating costs.

Our bank balance at the end of Sept. is \$128,306.

Governmental Affairs Janet Lopez

Greetings to all after a very successful Retreat in the Rockies in Breckenridge! Since the last newsletter, I have learned much and am overwhelmed with what all is happening in the legislative arena! We have been discussing finding your representatives as well as website resources to direct your attention to issues affecting you, your patients or your work environment. In this edition, we will switch gears a bit and revisit the information provided over this past year. ASPAN Strategic Work Groups (SWT) have geared up and are addressing how to help you inspire your legislators to listen and work for us; the Advocacy and Government Affairs SWT's will soon be releasing "elevator speech" key points extracted from both the Waste Anesthesia Gases (WAG) and Nurse Incivility white papers. These key points will be shared on the ASPAN website in the coming months for you to be able to email, call or write letters to your legislators. Links will also be posted on the RMPANA Government Affairs website as well. While there is federal legislation pending on Nurse Incivility, details are going nowhere fast. Additionally, two federal bills are in the process of becoming law and would potentially deter violence against nurses. One would develop a federal standard to develop a workplace violence prevention plan for healthcare facilities. The second would increase penalties for people who assault a healthcare worker, similar to penalties for assaulting a police officer.

So, I encourage you to keep an eye on the ASPAN website for these very useful upcoming resources to guide your communication and support your voice being heard. ASPAN will be asking our members to engage and use that very powerful voice. Get to know your legislators before sessions begin; let them know you are a nurse and that they can call on you for your expertise and input as they hear and think about healthcare issues. A great deal of amending goes into these bills based on nurses feedback.

On the state/local level, I have several homework assignments:


- 1) do you know if your hospital complied with **HB 1401**, that passed in 2022? Do you know that there should be a committee composed of 60% of STAFF nurses to come up with annual plans for staffing?
- 2) Does your facility/system have an advocacy group? Many do and are looking for nurses to join and have individuals that will guide you how to write letters/emails, speak with legislators and even testify for or against proposed bills that could affect your practice or patients in your community.

We do have some 'intel' regarding what issues the CO legislators will be looking at in the coming session that begins in January 2024: Safe staffing and Innovative staffing models, facility fees (big issue in the 2023 session that TOTALLY affects you and your colleagues), likely they will be revisiting issues of past such as HB 1401 mentioned above, and tort reform.

I challenge each one of you to seek the answers and get involved!



RMPANA Member Spotlight

RMPANA Member Joni Lauri BSN, RN, CPAN recently won a UCHealth Celebrating You Award in the category of Excellence.




Joni was nominated by RMPANA member Chelsea Chapman BSN, RN, CPAN. Chelsea said "Joni has been a valued member of the PACU for many years. He has the unique ability to see opportunities for growth and improvement when others might overlook them. We see anywhere from 80-110 cases a day through our PACU. Each patient receiving anesthesia, regardless of admission status, gets a pair of yellow "high fall risk" socks. For the outpatient population, these socks often were thrown in the trash after patient discharge. Joni saw this as an opportunity. He initiated a project to donate gently used hospital socks from PACU to homeless shelters in the Denver metro area. He gathered data to show that about 60% of outpatients did not want to take their socks home. He worked with the Infectious Disease team, and gained approval to donate socks from non-isolation, same-day surgery patients, as long as they were not visibly soiled or torn. Once he got approval, he created education for staff and put collection containers out on the unit for socks that met the criteria for donation. The bins are collected weekly by Joni, laundered, and dispersed to multiple shelters and facilities throughout the Denver Metro area, including Denver Rescue Mission and Mile High Behavioral Healthcare. The last update was that he had donated 320 pairs of socks to the Denver Rescue Mission!"
