Cassendra A. Munro, PhD, BS, RN, RNFA, CNOR, FAORN, FAAN









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Last month, AORN announced the recognition of distinguished individuals as Fellows of AORN. The AORN Fellowship acknowledges sustained and significant contributions to the perioperative profession. Among them was our chapter member, Cassendra A. Munro, Ph.D., BS, RN, RNFA, CNOR, FAORN, FAAN, who is best known as the creator of the Munro Pressure Ulcer Risk Assessment Scale for Perioperative Patients (Munro Scale).

It has been a year of accolades for Cassendra as she received the 2023 AORN Excellence in Perioperative Nursing Award and was recently inducted as a fellow into the American Academy of Nursing, nursing's highest academic and leadership honor.

Name and credentials?

Cassendra A. Munro, PhD, BS, RN, RNFA, CNOR, FAAN, FAORN

Stanford Health Care, Office of Research Patient Care Services, AND self-employed Munro Consulting.

How long have you been an OR nurse/nurse scientist?

I started in the OR in 1996 (27 yrs) and a Nurse Scientist for 15 years.

How long have you been in your current position?

just over 1.5 yrs.

What inspired you to become an OR nurse/nurse scientist?

Nursing was a suggestion since I did not really know what I wanted to be when I grew up. I waited 5 years after high school before starting my first nursing degree. In the master's program, I conducted my first study, which began the journey of instrument development and validation studies.

What do you enjoy about being an OR nurse/nurse scientist?

The role I miss the most is being an RNFA, as there is no greater privilege than actively participating in the surgical procedure. As a Nurse Scientist, I most enjoy being a consultant to nurses who have an idea (i.e. "there must be a better way to do this"). We generate new knowledge (evidence) to support their idea. Witnessing the transformation from fear of research to enjoying it is quite rewarding. Research can be fun, especially when you're passionate about making a difference!

What do you do to relax or have fun outside of work?

My husband Greg and I enjoy traveling and wine tasting. In October, we were in Barcelona and visited a winery that has been producing delicious wine since the 1500s. We also enjoy riding bicycles and Harley-Davidson motorcycles. So, when we travel, we sometimes rent and ride.

What career would you have chosen if you hadn't become a nurse?

I wanted to be a flight attendant to travel for free (well, free airfare!).


Outside of your professional accomplishments, what is one achievement of which you are most proud?





