All patients undergoing anesthesia require peripheral I.V. catheters to receive their sedation, postoperative pain medicines, and antiemetics. When a patient presents with difficult venous access, it is burdensome for both patient and nurse. Multiple sticks cause the patient pain and discomfort and increase their stress level. The common setback of thirty minutes for achieving I.V. access can delay lab results and procedure times.

Ultrasound guided I.V catheter insertion can increase success in achieving I.V access in patients when visualization, palpation, or other techniques are unsuccessful. Difficult I.V. access patients include ones with a history of obesity, I.V. drug use, dehydration, edema, or chronic

illnesses.
In facilities where there is no dedicated vascular access team, staff nurses can be trained using an

educational course approved by the organization's policy and

procedures. The Ultrasound-Guided Peripheral I.V. Insertion Course covers the basics of sonography, the ultrasound machine, and how to identify venous structures. Vein depth, catheter insertion angle, and catheter length knowledge are important for safe and effective insertion. The skill of holding and moving the probe, viewing of the needle, and successfully cannulating the vein require practice because it is different from traditional peripheral I.V. insertion. With proper training and practice, and ongoing competency, staff nurses can lead the way to decreasing the number of I.V. sticks, thereby increasing patient comfort and satisfaction. This will also keep the peri-anesthesia area running smoothly with timely lab results and preventing surgical

Instructions regarding preoperative medications: Hold vitamins, supplements, herbal products, and NSAIDs (Aleve, Advil, Naproxen, Ibuprofen/Motrin, Voltaren, Aspirin, etc.) 7 days prior to surgery, unless instructed differently by your physician. If you use over the counter Tylenol for your pain, it is ok to use as directed up until the night before surgery.
