CCRN Review Question

In a patient with ARDS, which contributes to the development of atelectasis?

- 1. decreased pulmonary vascular resistance and hypoxemia
- 2. increased pulmonary compliance and hypoxemia

stiffness of the fluid-filled non-aerated decrease in compliance. The end result is increased lung edema contribute to the cyanges in lung vascular tissue and and vascular tissue.
