Thank you again for this unforgettable experience and for all the ways you continue to inspire me.



CRRN BOOTCAMP 2025

Our CRRN Bootcamp was held on Friday, April 11, at Rancho Los Amigos National Rehabilitation Center. This year, the event gathered over 37 registrants, 12 vendors, and 9 speakers for a rather ambitious 8-hour day where we prepared rehab nurses for the CRRN certification exam. Experienced Rehab nurse experts presented information from each CRRN certification nursing domain that participants may be tested on in the exam. Domain 1 covered Nursing Models and Theories, which was presented by Paddy Higgins, and Izzah Panagaban, Domain 2 covered Functional Health Patterns that was presented by Lynn Wetherwax, Deepa Kannampuzha, Vicky Alvarenga, Adnan Haidar, and Yvette Trigueros, Domain 3 covered The Function of the Rehab Team and Transitions of Care that was covered by Elaine Morris and Paddy Higgins, and Domain 4 which was covered by Stephanie Lim, and Fatima Villacruz. At the end of the day, we discussed tips/tricks for test taking and did a 75 multiple-choice test review game where contestants were on teams to rally their teammates for the correct answer. The game participants all went away with Starbucks gift cards!

History of Rehabilitation Nursing in the VA By Geraldine Gutierrez

The history of rehabilitation nursing in the Veterans Affairs (VA) system began after World War I, when many Veterans returned with serious injuries. The Veterans Bureau, established in 1921, later became the Veterans Administration in 1930, laying the groundwork for Veteran health care services.

Following World War II, the VA saw a substantial increase in demand for rehabilitation due to complex injuries like spinal cord injuries, amputation, and traumatic brain injuries.

Specialized VA medical centers were established, and in 1946, the Prosthetic and Sensory Aids Service was created to enhance rehabilitative care.

The Korean War and Vietnam War increased the necessity for rehabilitation services, prompting further growth in the 1960s and 1970s, when rehabilitation nursing became recognized as a distinct specialty. By the 1980s and 1990s, training programs and certifications for rehabilitation nurses were well established, and the VA made significant contributions to research in the field.

Today, rehabilitation nursing is a crucial part of the VA health care system, offering comprehensive care for Veterans with various disabilities and chronic injuries. Serving as an Infection Preventionist at the VA Greater Los Angeles Healthcare System's Acute Rehabilitation Unit, I have the privilege of working alongside dedicated professionals who are committed to the health and well-being of Veterans. It is deeply rewarding to witness the resilience and progress of Veterans as they overcome significant challenges and regain their independence. Their recovery highlights the importance of our work.




Elaine Morris, BSN, RN IV, CRRN

Nomination for Judith H. Stanton Memorial Distinguished Nursing Award

Nominee's name: Adnan Haidar

Position/Title : Nurse Manager, Stroke/Neuro Rehab service

Mr. Adnan Haidar started his carrier as a Registered Nurse I at RLA Pediatric unit on January 3, 2000. He transitioned to Stroke Rehab service on June 2003 as a Registered Nurse I position. From there, he promoted step by step to Registered Nurse II in June 2007, then to Supervision Staff Nurse in May 2010, then to Nurse Manager/ Interim Nurse Manager in April 2020.

Since he joined RLA as Registered Nurse I, everyone who knew him mentioned that he not only participated in patient's care but also actively participate in unit-based quality improvement project, work collaboratively with the staff members of the unit to enhance patient care.

He brings his clinical experience, administrative experience in every step of his carrier. Mr. Haider also achieved Master of Science in Nursing Administration from University of Phoenix in January 2018. Theoretical experience adds to his practical administrative experience.

Mr. Haidar initiated multiple projects in the Stroke Rehab Service to improve patient satisfaction. One to the project called: "Sweet Dream". The aim of this project is to allow patient uninterrupted sleep from 10 PM to 6 AM if there is medically stable. Implement this project by coordinating with physician/providers to adjust medication timing to window of 6 AM to 10 PM, coordinating with nurses and nursing assistance to have assessment, medication administration and nighttime vital check around 10 PM, coordinated with facility management to reduce the environment disturbance such as noise from the door closing. Sweet Dream project really make patient to have good sleep at night and able to participate more in rehab on the following day. Now this project is spreading to other rehab services.

Independent trail project is one the successful project that initiated in the Stroke Rehab Service. When the patient is meeting independent functional level, therapists coordinated with nursing to initiate independent trial in the patient's room. Patient is monitored by day and night shift nursing outside of therapies hour to ensure patient is safe to perform their functional need independently. This project also improves patient outcome. Now this project is also spreading to other rehab service

Mr. Haidar is also leading the Fall Committee as a chair. He actively implemented projects that resulted in as significant decrease in the incidents of fall.

During year 2023, JPI 2 North was converted to Rehab unit with adding one more stroke rehab team. Patient care in rehab cannot be implemented with nursing care only, he collaborated with multidisciplinary team members in that converting process. Now successfully 2 North become one of Rehab Unit and RLA can be able to accepted more patient for rehabilitation.

Mr. Haidar continuously apply his knowledge and skills, demand high performance standards and expectations aligned with the mission, vision, and values of our healthcare organization.



From Overwhelming to Easy: Chapter Leadership Simplified Submitted by: The ARN Chapter Support Committee

Leadership in professional organizations can often feel intimidating, especially for busy rehabilitation nurses. To address this, the Association of Rehabilitation Nurses (ARN) Chapter Support Committee hosted a webinar titled "From Overwhelming to Easy: Chapter Leadership Simplified", offering practical strategies to make chapter leadership more accessible, manageable, and rewarding.

The session emphasized the power of shared leadership. When roles and responsibilities are clearly defined and distributed—such as in the Arizona Chapter's 12-member board - volunteering becomes less about heavy lifting and more about meaningful contribution. Volunteering not only supports the chapter's success but also boosts personal and professional growth.

Flexibility is key. Quarterly board meetings, micro-volunteering, and task delegation can prevent burnout and encourage more members to get involved. "Don't turn anyone away," presenters urged. "People need to feel valued and that they belong."

To grow membership, the committee recommended targeting CRRN candidates, reaching out to local facilities and nursing schools, and hosting outreach events. Collaborations between chapters, like the Texas Tri-Chapter Social, demonstrate how sharing resources and events can strengthen community bonds and expand opportunities for engagement.
