About the Presenters





Mathies is also a dedicated martial arts practitioner with over 30 years of experience. He owns and operates a Brazilian Jiu-Jitsu and Mixed Martial Arts academy for the past 25 years, earning national and international recognition both as a competitor and as a coach. In addition to training athletes, Mathies has developed specialized curricula for women's self-defense, military and law enforcement personnel, and anti-child abduction programs.
