Where has the time gone? Can you believe Thanksgiving will be in a couple of weeks! I hope you're enjoying the last few days of fall. It's a crisp 46 degrees as I write this message. I love fall weather!

This past week I was at our state Capitol advocating for the ***surgical smoke evacuation bill***, HB27. Several nurses and techs throughout the Commonwealth attended. Jordan Fuhrman, PSNA Director of Government Affairs, was our escort throughout the day. We met with 21 legislators and staff members to discuss HB27. The bill passed in the House and the Senate Health and Human Services Committee by large margins. The bill currently sits in the Senate Appropriations Committee awaiting a vote. Until the state budget passes, we don't anticipate much activity on the bill. All the members of state government that we met were extremely supportive of this bipartisan bill. I'll keep you posted on its progression.



At the October Board of Directors, we agreed to send a contribution to the Central PA Food Bank as we do each year. A 'match' is currently in progress. Our donation of \$2000 will go a long way to support families experiencing food insecurity.

The November chapter meeting will be held at the Penn State Lancaster Medical Center on Tuesday, November 11. Cindy Thompson will present on medical mission trips. Cindy is spearheading a trip to Africa in the spring and needs nurses and techs. Please plan to attend the meeting at 7:00 PM, room 2106 and share the information with your colleagues. The Senate is scheduled to meet in September, October, November and December. Hopefully the bill will come up for a vote before the end of the year. Kathy will keep members informed if assistance is needed to contact legislators. Local state legislators were invited to attend tonight's presentation by Brenda Ulmer.

We have Food & Beverage Shifts. Please send an email to sign your volunteers up. Include your group name in your email with the volunteer's full name and email address. Include the date(s) and shift times that they would like to volunteer for. Shifts are filled first come first served. Please see the attached Volunteer Manual for parking, check in and dress code information.

Make special note - the check in location is now in Volunteer Check In in the Historic Hersheypark Arena - the same location where volunteers checked out.

As a reminder Food and Beverage volunteers are required to take the F&B Volunteer training and fill out the F&B Volunteer Acknowledgement

Volunteers will follow these steps to complete the Food & Beverage training prior to their shift:

2. After watching the training, you MUST fill out the form [F&B Volunteer Acknowledgment](#) form

In addition we have received RAMP Codes! If you have anyone interested in getting RAMP certified or recertified, please send your volunteer's name, email address, and we can send you the RAMP certification instructions.

The volunteer must be at least 21 years old and be willing to commit to at least 3 RAMP shifts during each year the RAMP certification is valid. RAMP certificates are valid for 2 years.
