## **Overall:**

- 1750 Character limit
- No personal or organizational identifiers- submissions with personal or organizational names in the abstract will be disqualified and not sent for peer review
- No products names or endorsements- submissions with products names in the abstract will be disqualified and not sent for peer review
- Grammatical and spelling errors will immediately disqualify an abstract.
- Abstracts with derogatory language, or that clearly insult sections of an audience due to religion, political beliefs, or personal viewpoints will be immediately disqualified.
- References not included in the body of the abstract

## **Abstract Body**

### **I. Content: Inputs**

- **Environmental Scanning:** Clearly describes the information gathered through environmental scanning that prompted the NPD practitioner to take action.
- **Needs Identification/Gap Analysis:** Clearly articulates the data used to identify the need or gap addressed by the initiative.
- **Relevance:** The identified need/gap is relevant to nursing professional development
- **Evidence-Based:** Demonstrates an evidence-based approach to identifying the need/gap.
- **Problem Statement:** Clearly articulates the problem being addressed.
- **Target Audience:** Clearly identifies the target audience for the initiative.

### **II. Content: Throughputs**

- **NPD Initiative Description:** Provides a clear and comprehensive description of the NPD initiative.
- **Stakeholder Involvement:** Clearly describes how stakeholders were involved in the initiative.
- **NPD Practitioner Actions:** Clearly and thoroughly describes the specific actions taken by the NPD practitioner(s) in the initiative.
- **Intervention:** Describes the implementation process and any strategies used, including evidence based frameworks.

- **Resources & Strategies:** Discusses the resources utilized and strategies employed for implementation

### **III. Content: Outputs**

- **Outcomes of the Initiative:** Clearly articulates the outcomes of the initiative.
- **Measurement of Outcomes:** Clearly describes how the outcomes were measured, including data collection methods. If initiative is not complete, discuss how outcomes will be measured.
- **Feedback Loop & Communication:** Explains how the information was communicated back to stakeholders through a feedback loop.
- **Impact:** Discusses the significance and impact of the outcomes on practice, patient care, or the organization.
- **Future Implications/Next Steps:** Identifies future implications, next steps, or potential for sustainability/replication.
