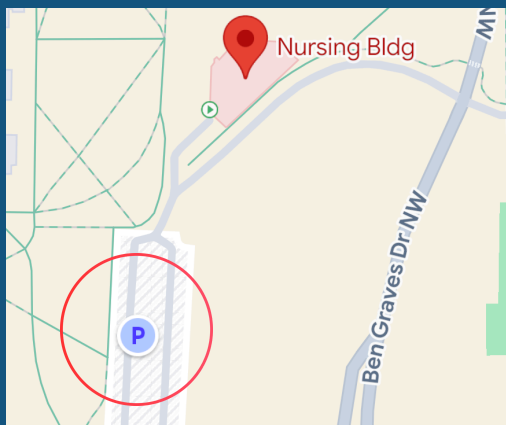

Course Description

This two-day intensive review is designed for experienced critical/progressive care nurses preparing for CCRN or PCCN certification, seeking clinical updates, or earning CEUs. The course follows the latest exam test plan, covers all major systems, and focuses on the nursing care of critically ill patients.

Critical Care Academy is an approved provider by the California Board of Registered Nursing, CEP# 17001. Course approved for 14 contact hours. Attendance for both days is required. No partial hours will be awarded.

Course Learning Objectives

- Review anatomy, physiology, and key assessment findings for all body systems.
- Explore major critical care diseases, including etiology, signs, diagnostics, and nursing interventions.
- Differentiate and manage various shock states.
- Interpret hemodynamic data, labs, and pharmacologic therapies to optimize organ function.
- Discuss pulmonary issues and ventilator management in acute/critical care settings.
- Review diabetes types and neuro-endocrine hormone impacts.
- Recognize normal and abnormal coagulation, fibrinolysis, and inflammation in sepsis and coagulopathies.
- Apply case studies to identify dysfunctions in cardiac, respiratory, neuro, endocrine, and renal systems.
