The Donate Eight Simulation Center, located at the LiveOnNY Headquarters in Queens, is a state-of-the-art facility which enhances training for Clinical Operations staff and educates the public about the lifesaving process of organ donation. With a focus on excellence in donor care, the Simulation Center ensures our heroes' legacies live on through the gift of life.

The Donate Eight Simulation Center, made possible by the generous support of Donate Eight and LiveOnNY Foundation, advances excellence in organ donor care through trainings for LiveOnNY clinical and field staff and education for the public on the lifesaving process of organ donation.

The Center includes a fully equipped mock Operating Room and mock Intensive Care Unit designed to train employees in donor case management within a controlled and immersive environment.

By offering insight into the intricacies of organ donation, the center aims to raise awareness and understanding of the importance of organ and tissue donation, and the extraordinary effort involved in saving and changing lives through these gifts.
