Topic: "The Role of Nursing in Violence Reduction: Call to Action"

Dr. Williams was installed as the first male and the 12th President of the National Black Nurses Association (NBNA) on August 2, 2015. He earned a BSN degree in 1986 from William Carey University, Hattiesburg, MS and a MSN with a focus in Adult Health from the University of South Alabama, Mobile, Alabama in 1991. He earned a Doctor of Nursing Practice Degree from the Frances Payne Bolton School of Nursing at Case Western Reserve University, Cleveland, OH.

He has presented locally and nationally on a variety of health relate topics and extensively on violence reduction. CNN featured him in a segment on Health Care Reform entitled "A Nursing Professor Rejoices." Currently, he serves on many boards, a few are the Haiti Nursing Foundation, and Minority Nurse Magazine Advisory Committee.

Dr. Williams was inducted into the William Carey University Hall of Fame on March 28, 2015, received the NBNA Trailblazer Award, and applauded as one of the Great 100 Nurses of New Orleans, and more. Resides in Los Angeles. CA.

Bit of History

The Kent County Kalamazoo-Muskegon Michigan Black Nurses Association (KMMBNA) is an organization headquartered in Kent County, with members in Grand Rapids, Kentwood, Kalamazoo, Muskegon, Battle Creek and other cities in West Michigan.

KMMBNA was founded in 1974 as the non-chartered Grand Rapids Black Nurses Association. Birthale Archie, a young nurse who had just completed nursing school, was the founder, visionary and convener of our chapter at her home in 1974. One of the chapter's first activities was the Future Nurses Club at South High School, in which they provided students with the opportunity to obtain experience in a hospital setting through the Candy Stripe Program at Saint Mary's Hospital. The future nurses were able to feed patients, pass food trays and run errands, among other duties. Our Mission was to encourage more minorities to pursue careers in health care, as well as to advocate for and educate the African American community on health, in an effort to promote greater parity in health care services.

Continue the Journey to Becoming KMMBNA.

In 1990, Birthale Archie was elected to the Board of Directors of the National Black Nurses Association (NBNA) in Washington, D.C. Birthale began to explore establishing an officially chartered chapter of the NBNA. In 1997, several interested nurses were asked to meet at her home to explore a NBNA Chapter Charter. The mission of the chapter would be to provide a vehicle for nurses to address nursing care, and health issues for the unserved and underserved in order to experience optimum quality health care services. The KMMBNA Chapter of the National Black Nurses Association applied for its charter at the 27th Institute and Conference in Atlanta, Georgia, and received its official charter in August 1999.
