Christine Bochen, PhD

Christine Bochen is a professor of Religious Studies at Nazareth College in Rochester, NY. Holder of a master's and a doctorate from the Catholic University of America, she studies and teaches Roman Catholic theology, feminist Theology, American religions, and spirituality.

Anthony Cerulli, PhD

Dr. Cerulli is an assistant professor of Religious Studies at Hobart William Smith College. His upcoming articles and books include, Medical Texts and Manuscripts in Indian Cultural History, and "Calculating Fecundity in the Kāśvapa Samhitā." In Health and Religious Rituals in South Asia: Disease, Possession, and Healing, edited by Fabrizio Ferrari.

Rabbi Rachel Smookler

Smookler was ordained in 1998 from HUC-JIR. She has served as a rabbi for 16 years. During this time, she has served in Elmira to a Conservative segregation, and as far as Tokyo where she served as an Interim rabbi. Currently she is the Rabbi at Temple Beth David here in Rochester.

Etin Anwar Ph.D

Etin Anwar is Associate Professor of Religious Studies at Hobart and William Smith Colleges, Geneva. She teaches introductory classes on Islam, gender, and comparative ethics. She is the author of Gender and Self in Islam (Routledge, 2006). She has published several articles on Ibn Sina, Meister Eckhart, Ibn Arabi, and the women's movements in Indonesia in various journals including Islamic Studies, Islam and Christian-Muslim Relations, and Hawwa. She is a contributor to Encyclopedia of Islam and the Muslim World, edited Richard Martin, ed. (New York: Macmillan Reference USA, 2004), on "The Public Role of Women" and "Harem". She has also been featured in the WXXI TV documentary called Muslim Women in our Midst: The Path to Understanding in conjunction with America at the Crossroads (2006). Her research interests include Islamic feminism and the Indonesian diaspora in America.
