

## What is ENLS?

The Emergency Neurological Life Support (ENLS) course is designed to help healthcare professionals improve patient care and outcomes during the critical first hours of a patient's neurological emergency. ENLS demonstrates a collaborative, multi-disciplinary approach and provides a consistent set of protocols, practical checklists, decision points, and suggested communication to use during patient management.

This activity is designated for a maximum of 15 AMA PRA CME, ANCC, ACPE and CECBEMS credits upon completion. There are on-line materials that the learner will have to access as well as an on-line test which the learner will have to successfully complete in order to be successful in the course.

# **Protocols**

ENLS is made up of 14 protocols. Each protocol was designed and written by neurointensivists and emergency medicine physicians. These protocols are designed to provide the same advice an expert in neurocritical care would provide if called and asked, "What should I do in the first hour to best help this patient and hand them off to you?"

- 1. Acute Non-Traumatic Weakness
- 2. Acute Ischemic Stroke
- 3. Acute Stroke
- 4. Airway, Ventilation and Sedation
- 5. Approach to the Comatose Patient
- 6. Intracerebral Hemorrhage
- 7. Intracranial Hypertension and Herniation
- 8. Meningitis and Encephalitis
- 9. Pharmacotherapy
- 10. Resuscitation Following Cardiac Arrest
- 11. Spinal Cord Compression
- 12. Status Epilepticus
- 13. Subarachnoid Hemorrhage
- 14. Traumatic Brain Injury

#### **Conference Location:**

The conference will be held in the 4<sup>th</sup> floor auditorium of the Student Faculty Center (SFC) located on the corner of Broad and Ontario Streets on the Temple University Health Sciences Campus. The SFC (3340 N. Broad St) is across the street from Temple University Hospital.

#### **Conference Materials:**

Once you are registered, approximately one week prior to the course, you will be sent via email an access code from which you will download the course materials from the Neurocritical Care website. This will include the different protocols. There will be no course materials given out the day of the course. Your access code will be valid for one year which will enable you to log back into the website after the course to review materials and complete the verification test.

### **Parking:**
