

On October 7 and October 14, St. Camillus hosted the AACN-GMAC CCRN/PCCN Review Course with Kay Hoppe. We had 19 registrants comprised of nurses from across the state both with and without their certifications. We had one participant from Wausau and one from an LTAC! We signed 3 people up for GMAC memberships on day 1 of the review course.

Jessica Panfil and myself were present for both days with an AACN/GMAC table as well as a certification table which provided participants with information on joining both AACN and GMAC. Information was also provided for CCRN, PCCN, cardiac surgery and cardiac medicine subspecialty examinations. Jessica and I also provided examples of study materials that we used to pass our respective certification exams.

The course was enjoyed by all, even some of the residents of San Camillo who occasionally popped by! We got several inquiries on how often we offer the course both from people who were there as well as from some who were unable to make it. As of two years ago, the decision was made to plan a review every other year. We will continue to evaluate the needs of the community and local nurses for how often the review course should be held. Once again, Kay did a fabulous job of making the review course interactive and engaging. She encouraged participants to join in on the conversation instead of just listening to her talk for 16 hours about complex and difficult topics. The course included everything from case studies to actual review questions. GMAC would like to thank Kay Hoppe for her devotion to not only her continual renewal of her certifications, but for her devotion to teaching the current profession as well as future of progressive and critical care nurses.

GMAC did come out in the positive this year and that is due to the extreme generosity of St. Camillus. Back at the end of 2015 our own Mary Kay was at St. Camillus for a personal function and made this amazing connection that we now have to look forward to in the future. "I love teaching our nursing students in the classroom, the simulation lab and in clinical settings," Dressler said. "It is a privilege to impact the education of students who will help create the future of healthcare."

During the Briggs & Al's Run and Walk, five of us Marquette nursing students were given a wonderful opportunity to work behind the scenes in the medical tent. When we first arrived, we were able to help organize the supplies and cots in the tent and were given a quick overview of the possible problems that could arise during the event, as well as signs/symptoms to watch for. Many of us were able to pair up with medical students and drive along the course in golf carts observing the runners and looking for anyone who may need medical attention. Luckily not too many people needed immediate medical assistance, but the help we were able to provide was valuable. Your research and hard work to include families in the care of their loved ones may change the practice of healthcare providers nationwide! See the article below that explains this amazing opportunity.

Community Memorial Hospital on being accepted as participants in the Society of Critical Care Medicine's *PCOR-ICU Collaborative: Improving Care for Critically Ill Patients and Families through Research Dissemination and Implementation* which is funded by a Eugene Washington Engagement Award from the Patient-Centered Outcomes Research Institute (PCORI). PCOR is an independent, nonprofit, nongovernmental organization located in Washington, DC, and was authorized by Congress in 2010. The goal is to improve the quality and relevance of evidence available to help patients, caregivers, clinicians, employers, insurers, and policy makers make informed health decisions. It is designed to improve patient care and outcomes through patient-centered comparative clinical effectiveness research, or CER.

Unfortunately, traditional medical research, for all of the remarkable advances in care it produces, hasn't been able to answer many of the questions that patients and their clinicians face daily. When reliable information does exist, it's not always available to patients and/or families, in ways they can understand or use most effectively. Through identifying critical research questions and funding of CER, the goal is to determine which of the many healthcare options work best in particular circumstances. This nationwide collaborative involves 63 intensive care units throughout all regions of the United States and involves both adult and pediatric ICUs as well as a variety of types (academic, non-teaching, community, medical, respiratory, surgical/trauma, neuro, coronary and cardiovascular). The purpose of the initiative is to develop and measure the impact of interventions on patient centered care. The timeframe for participation will be from September 2016 through July 2017. Data and results will be available sometime in November 2017.

The ICU at CMH will be specifically focusing on integrating patients and families into daily multidisciplinary rounds. Children's Hospital of Wisconsin will be participating in the integration of structured patient and family care conferences to mutually establish the goals of care. Other collaborative projects include:

- Disseminating information and providing support to families to assist with the care of their loved one
- Implementing open visitation (non-restricted ICU hours)
- Enabling family presence during invasive procedures in the ICU
- Enabling family presence during resuscitation in the ICU
- Facilitating the use of patient and family ICU diaries
- Investigating and planning for implementation of a post-ICU clinic
- Implementing integrative therapies, such as music or pets, in the ICU setting
- Forming or enhancing an effective patient and family advisory group
- Other project of the team's choice relevant to patient- and family-centered care
