The Sojourns Scholar Leadership Program:

- Identifies outstanding nurse and physician emerging leaders who are improving knowledge about, quality of, and access to palliative care.
- Awards each individual a two-year, \$180,000 grant to support a vigorous leadership career plan and an innovative research, clinical, educational or policy project to advance palliative care.
- Assigns a national palliative care leader to mentor each Scholar while implementing the leadership career plan.
- Hosts an annual Sojourns Scholar Leadership Summit offering further opportunities for palliative care learning and leadership development.
- Develops the professional visibility and advances the palliative care expertise of the Sojourns Scholars, enhancing their ability to bring innovation and leadership to a national platform.
