BloodCenter of Wisconsin (BCW) believes that organ and tissue donation is as vital as blood donation to our community. In 2011, Wisconsin Donor Network which serves the eastern part of Wisconsin and the Wisconsin Tissue Bank which serves all of Wisconsin became part of BloodCenter of Wisconsin. BCW recognizes the role that nurses play in caring for the patients and families of organ donors and recipients. Care provided during this time exemplifies the American Association of Critical-Care Nurses (AACN) values of integrity, dignity, collaboration and excellence in patient care. In support of this work, the Joan Heimler Legacy of Life scholarship was established in 2011 to recognize those nurses that strive to achieve these values in caring for patients and families during the organ/tissue donation process. Nurses from all over Wisconsin have submitted essays sharing their stories of patients and families of organ donors. Each year a nurse has been awarded the scholarship and has had the opportunity to attend AACN NTI.

How can you apply?

- Complete the Scholarship Application form (you may need to download Adobe Reader)
- Provide a copy of your CV or resume
- Write an essay of 1000 words or less that explains your role in caring for patients and families making a decision to donate organs and tissue
- Ask your Nurse Manager or Supervisor for a letter of support
- Applications must be postmarked no later than March 1, 2017



The team-based approach to reducing pressure injuries led to a <u>65% reduction</u> in pressure ulcers—a significant cost savings. The outcomes were so impressive that the team was recognized by 3M with its Award for Excellence in Skin Safety. What you do at the bedside <u>Matters</u>—it makes in difference in our patient's quality of life, in the length of their stay and ultimately in the cost of that stay. And that's a little financial food for thought.


