Message from the Vice President Elect— Amanda Hackbarth

Here is what our Vice President Elect had to say about the 2017 Midwest Conference...

The AACN Midwest Conference, hosted by the Northwest Chicago Chapter of AACN, took place the 23rd and 24th of March this year. The Eaglewood Resort & Spa in Itsaca, IL provided exceptional hospitality as the backdrop for some serious evidence-based learning for over 300 attendees each day. A total of 13 vendors were on hand to provide information about and demonstration of their patient care equipment as well as 23 content experts to present at a grand total of 32 breakout session offerings and 2 keynote presentations. On top of that, three vendor-sponsored sessions were available outside of scheduled conference hours. In all, participants had the opportunity to walk away from this impressive offering with up to 13 CEUs.

Thursdays sessions started off with a very uplifting keynote speech from current AACN President, Clareen Wiencek. She invited us all to reflect on the moment that we each *knew* that we matter. She highlighted the importance of bedside nurses as driving forces in forward-progress of patient care in America's hospitals while reminding us that there is still much work to do. Her keynote set the tone for a full day of learning with topics spanning cardiac care, best practice implementation, a dash of trauma, some discussion on healthy work environments and bit about the fine line between ICU care and end of life care emphasizing where Palliative care specialists fit into that dynamic.

Friday morning was off to a splendid start with Dave Hanson, Past AACN President, offering a Keynote presentation addressing change fatigue and tips on remaining resilient through it all. His presentation, aptly named "Continual, Non-stop, Unrelenting, Constant, Never-ending Change: Survival Strategies for Nurses" really struck a chord with many of the nurses in attendance. He drove home the dangers of nurses becoming disengaged—increased stress and fatigue in staff translates into poor staff retention and, even scarier, a decline in patient safety. While his presentation was highly relatable for those in formal management positions, even bedside staff could come out of the session with a feeling of ownership and empowerment to handle the onslaught of day to day changes. The remainder of the day played out with sessions covering CV surgery populations, Sepsis standards of care, Stroke management and small smattering of ethics, advocacy and professional recognition.

The 2017 Midwest Conference was a well put together event with camaraderie, rejuvenation and networking opportunities reminiscent of a smaller version of NTI in addition, of course, to offering an abundance of relevant knowledge. Given the close proximity, smaller time and financial commitment and more intimate setting, this event is well worth attending if you aren't able to attend to NTI—or even if you are!

IT MATTERS to Become a GMAC Board Member



The Future Matters!

GMAC's Board of Directors is elected annually by chapter members. The board is the governing body of the chapter and is charged with the responsibility to engage members in a variety of activities by providing educational, social and philanthropic events throughout the year. Many Board Positions are available for the 2017-2018 year. Which one fits you?

President

The President's fundamental responsibility is to lead the board of directors in their governance of the chapter. The President is accountable to oversee meetings of the board and chapter, develop the future goals and annual objectives for the chapter, formulate the annual budget, and ensure regular communication to the chapter regarding progress toward the annual objectives and the financial status of the chapter. This is a one year commitment after serving in the elect position for one year prior.

President-Elect

The President-Elect is the member of the executive board who provides continuity of leadership of the chapter. During the president-elect year, he or she becomes familiar with the responsibilities of the president, in preparation for succession to the presidency at the term expiration or resignation. In addition, the president-elect is prepared to perform the duties of the president in their absence or inability to act. This is a one year commitment with the assumption you would move into the president position for an additional year.

Vice President/Education Chair

It is the vice president's responsibility to lead the education committee. The VP coordinates the functions of the education team to provide high quality and relevant educational programming for chapter members. This is a one year commitment after serving in the elect position for one year.

GMAC Board Positions, Cont'd.

Vice President-Elect

The vice president-elect becomes familiar with the duties of the vice president so he or she may succeed the vice president at the expiration of his or her term or resignation. In addition, the vice president-elect performs the duties of the office of the VP in their absence or inability to act. The vice president-elect also works with the VP to coordinate educational programming for the chapter. This is a one year commitment with the assumption you would move into the vice-president position for an additional year.

Treasurer

The Treasurer is responsible for the ongoing management, accounting, and reporting of the chapter's finances. This includes developing the budget, ensuring reporting requirements to National are met and that the chapter finances are reported to the full membership on a regular basis. This is a one year commitment after serving in the elect position for one year.

Treasurer-Elect

The treasurer-elect becomes familiar with the duties of the treasurer so he or she may succeed the treasurer at the expiration of his or her term or resignation. In addition, the treasurer-elect performs the duties of the office of the treasurer in the absence of the treasurer or their inability to act. This is a one year commitment with the assumption you would move into the treasurer position for an additional year.

Secretary

The secretary facilitates open communication between the chapter, executive board, committees, membership, and the community. The secretary adheres to the policies and procedures of the chapter and the AACN Board of Directors in all correspondence. In addition, the secretary provides continuity of chapter proceedings through record keeping of all official activities. This is a two-year commitment.

Member-At-Large/Social Media and Outreach Chair

The member-at-large functions as a liaison to members, coordinates outreach programs, and facilitates communication between the executive board and the members by organizing The Monitor, chapter website and Facebook account. The member-at-large leads also communicates with hospitals, schools, vendors, and other professionals within the community. This is a one year commitment and more than one person can share the responsibilities.

Member-At-Large/ Membership Chair

The member-at-large leads the chapter's membership by coordinating all membership registration, facilitating payment of dues and tracking attendance at education meetings. This is a one year commitment.

Board Learning Partner

In this position you spend the year as a board member learning the roles of all the positions and helping out with projects to get a feel for where you best fit.

Scholarship Opportunity

The Wisconsin League for Nursing proudly promotes the profession of nursing through scholarships awarded to enrolled undergraduate, graduate, and high school nursing students.

Scholarship Program

The Wisconsin League for Nursing (WLN) Scholarship Program is available to Wisconsin residents currently enrolled in Schools of Nursing. All scholarships are awarded at the WLN Conference. Scholarship winners will be announced in 2017 and awarded only if monies are available.

Donors that have supported the WLN scholarships in past years include:

The <u>ANTHEM Blue Cross Blue Shield Foundation Grant</u> is to be awarded to students who are either working towards an ADN, bachelors of science in nursing or graduate degree (MS, DNP, or PhD) in nursing currently enrolled in a nursing program and have finished at least half of their nursing credits.

<u>Deaconess School of Nursing Alumnae Association, Inc. Scholarship:</u> the LaVerne Foster Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a high school senior who has been accepted to a nursing or pre-nursing program. The Russell Seager Memorial Scholarship is given in memory of a 1981 Deaconess graduate killed at Fort Hood in 2009.

Herbert H. Kohl Charities Scholarship

<u>Greater Milwaukee Foundation Scholarship</u> and the <u>Jeannette McKelvey Scholarship</u> is given to students from Milwaukee, Waukesha, Washington or Ozaukee counties.

<u>Helen Daniels Bader Fund</u> supports a grant through WLN's efforts to promote advanced nursing studies, with an emphasis on gerontology in rural areas of Wisconsin. The WLN offers tuition support to individuals who will focus on gerontology as they pursue an advanced practice nursing degree or post-master's certificate of education degree.

An additional grant subsidy by the HDBF focuses on adult geriatric certification of registered nurses and advanced practice nurses in the immediate post-graduation period. This unique grant reimburses eligible applicants who do not have financial support from employers to take the certification tests.

The scholarship funded by NurseTim, Inc. provides support to a doctoral-level nurse educator student.

A divided distribution of \$5,000.00 annually one year grant for credentialing support of post-graduate candidates (BSN, MSN, DNP, PhD) whose intent is to seek a Certification in ADULT GERONTOLOGY.

Criteria: ② Employed in a setting that provide care for geriatric clients in the STATE of WISCONSIN ② A resident of the STATE of WISCONSIN ② A Wisconsin Licensed registered nurse in good standing through the Board of Nursing ② Intent to take an Adult-Geriatric Credentialing TEST within 6 months of the application. ② The CREDENTIALING FUNDS cannot be used for re-credentialing as the goal of the demonstration project is to increase the number of certified nurses in the State of Wisconsin ② Current Job description OR in the case of a recent graduate of an advanced nursing degree program (Clinical Nurse Specialist or Doctorate of Nursing), planned employment validation that requires certification as a basis for employment with an employment affidavit of applicant's current or intended job outlining adult-geriatric knowledge or skills requirements. ② The following certification areas will be considered as described by the American Nursing Credentialing Center ANCC and endorsed by the American Geriatrics Society: ② Gerontological Nursing Certification ② Clinical Nurse Specialist Certification ② Adult-Gerontology CNS ② Gerontological CNS ② Nurse Practitioner Certifications ② Adult-Gerontology Primary Care NP ② Gerontological NP.

Process of Review and Award: 2 Applications will be reviewed on a case by case review process—based on criteria and funds will be disbursed until the Demonstration CREDENTIALING FUNDS are exhausted FOR A DISBURSEMENT YEAR. 🛭 The credentialing applicants will complete an application submission process requesting, personal residence and contact information in addition to academic degree completion, employment certification, letter of endorsement from the employer demonstrating an agency strategic goal or job requirements for advanced certification where employer financial support for credentialing is NOT available, and a statement from the applicant indicating the purpose and intended timing of the credentialing TESTING. 2 A Letter of Completion of the ADULT-GERONTOLOGIC Certification from the credentialing agency MUST be submitted to the WLN within 6 months of the disbursement. The grant money will be disbursed in reimbursement to the grant recipient after submission of verification of testing outcome within 6 months and submission of copies of the payment and application from the credentialing agency (ANCC or other). 2 The amounts of these credentialing test disbursements may vary depending on the testing credential and agency. 2 It is the intent of this grant funding to support the increase in specialty gerontology certified nurses in the State of Wisconsin. Therefore, passing scores with credentialing is the intended outcome. WLN desires to support passing candidates who are dedicated to prepare for these exams. If a candidate fails to pass the first attempt, guidance from the WLN scholarship committee will be provided by the WLN scholarship committee to encourage successful retesting within the 5-month period. 2 This Credentialing Campaign ends when the annual fund amount is fully disbursed and verified.

The Wisconsin League for Nursing, in cooperation with the Helen Daniels Bader Fund, reserve the right to alter and amend these awards, rules and disbursements related to the above referenced scholarships and grants. Funds are distributed according to a Helen Daniels Bader Fund approved distribution plan in accordance with the criteria reviewed by the Wisconsin League for Nursing Scholarship Committee and the Executive Board and WLN Directors.
