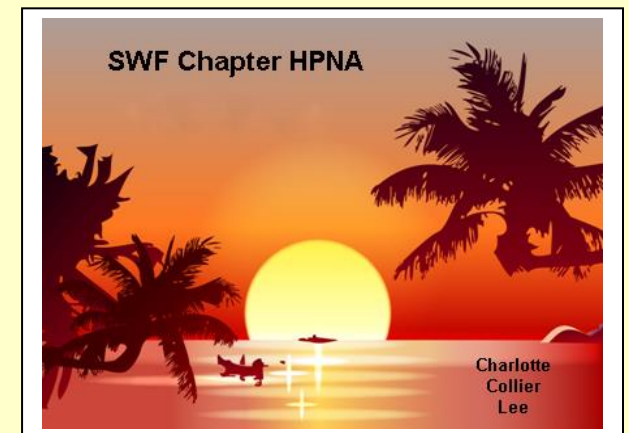

## Program

The SWF Chapter of HPNA is pleased to offer two exciting educational programs for health care professionals and those in civic and faith-based organizations in our tri-county area.

Soul Injury is defined as a spectrum of penetrating wounds caused by un mourned loss and unforgiven guilt/shame that causes one to become separated from their own sense of self.

The 2-hour Soul Injury educational program teaches us how to assess and respond to acute and chronic trauma in individuals which may manifest as Soul Injury.
