Building Strong Foundations: Advancing Perioperative Practice Through Evidence-Based Preceptor Development



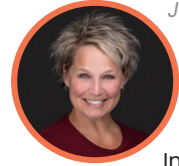

This project describes the implementation of an evidence-based preceptor training program tailored to the unique needs of a large interdisciplinary perioperative department at a Level I trauma center. The NPD-led curriculum targets seven core preceptor competencies for all perioperative roles (RN, CST, unlicensed personnel, CSS) and resulted in high participation, strong learner satisfaction, and significant improvements in perceived preceptor competence across multiple domains.

Can Implicit Trust in Our Team Lead to Medical Errors
