Current Draft Includes Prohibition of Flavored Nicotine Vaping Products, all Flavors

Mirrors the Emergency Public Health Rule (with some variation)


What is Possible? Does it Have to Mirror the Emergency Rule?

No. The Permanent Rule can evolve, based on feedback received during the Rulemaking process and public hearings. This is IMPORTANT because it means it can expand the scope of covered products to include: all other tobacco products (cigarettes, pipes, little cigars...). It can also expand to include online sales.

In addition to youth, this addition ensures that ALL of Michigan's kids are protected, and doesn't leave kids from any demographic behind.

The Administration's plan announced in January leaves thousands of kid-friendly e-cigarette flavors and products on the market.

Disposable e-cigarettes are a growing threat to our kids

- Among high school e-cigarette users, use of disposable e-cigarettes increased by 1,000% from 2019 to 2020 (from 2.4% to 26.5%).
- The market share of disposable devices nearly doubled between August 2019 and May 2020, from 10.3% to 19.8% of e-cigarette sales.

 Disposable e-cigarettes are cheap, sold in lots of flavors and can deliver huge amounts of nicotine

The surgeon who transplanted two lungs into a teenage boy who was going to die from vaping used the word "evil."

Another doctor at <u>Henry Ford Hospital</u> in Detroit on Tuesday afternoon openly begged anyone who vapes to stop.


Dr. Hassan Nemeh, the surgical director of Thoracic Organ Transplant, said the inflammation and scarring in the 17-year-old's lungs were "nothing that I have ever seen" across 20 years of similar surgeries.


History of Cigarette Use and Current Use of E-Cigarette UseUse



After multiple attempts to enact a flavor ban without adequate stakeholder input, Michigan's Governor, Gretchen Whitmer, is turning to the state's Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) again to enact a dangerous ban on flavored vapor products.

If adopted, the MDHHS rule would ban the sale of flavored vapor products regardless of market authorization from the FDA.
