- v10 not by an alone faith, but faith that produces obedience can't separate, just don't get the wrong order!
- v11 God's purpose for salvation is about joy
  - Piper: "God is most glorified when we are most satisfied in Him." Beware of cynicism which leads to lack of joy, instead abide in Christ with a child-like faith (Mt 18:1-6)
