Prayer 1: When you are under attack, take refuge in the Lord as your righteous defender. 1-7

- 1. When under attack, take refuge in the Lord through prayer
 - A. Pray honestly
 - B. Pray personally
 - C. Pray persistently
 - D. Pray systematically
 - E. Pray expectantly
- 2. When under attack, appeal to God as the Righteous Judge
 - A. God is holy separate from evil, He will judge evildoers
 - B. Know the God who is!
- 3. When under attack, come to God by His Grace
 - A. Know God's tremendous and abundant mercy!
 - B. Worship God because of His great mercy for you!

Prayer 2: When you are under attack, take refuge in the Lord as your righteous defender. 8-12

- 1. When under attack, pray for the Lord to keep you in His righteous path
- 2. When under attack, remember God is the righteous Judge
- 3. When under attack, take joyful refuge in the Lord as your righteous defender.

Discuss:

- We've approached this Psalm as two prayers with very similar outlines. In v3 the Psalmist
 writes "in the morning I prepare a sacrifice for you and watch." How should, how do you 'prepare'
 or 'arrange' your prayers?
- Some allow attacks of others to drive them away from the Lord while for others it causes them to run to the Lord. What makes the difference?
- Sometimes it is hard to consider that God will judge the unrighteous. Read Rev. 18:20.
 What should be our attitude? How should the Gospel relate?
- Should we tell arrogant, unrepentant sinners that God loves them? Defend.
- Consider these prayers. How can we know when it is right to defend ourselves before attackers or simply ignore them?

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
