God's Grace – attacked from 2 sides:

- 1. God's grace is counter to the world's system of merit Good performance usually earns rewards Most religions are merit-based (do this to be accepted)
- 2. God's grace often mistaken for licentiousness (Jude 4)
 Called a legalist if you emphasize God's law
 Would a Holy God save sinners so they can sin freely or live for Him?

God's Grace trains us for godliness & good works: 1. God's Grace brings salvation to all kinds of people

- Jn 1:14 Jesus came to display God's Grace Jn 3:17; Lk 1:76-79
- not all men , otherwise universalism, instead all kinds of people (context v1-10)
- God's grace is for all kinds of people:
 - Paul chief of sinners (1 Tim 1:13-15)
 - YOU!
 - Not the self-righteous Lk 5:32

2. God's grace trains those who are saved in godliness

12-14a

- Grace trains us to deny ungodliness & worldly desires 12a once saved, never the same. Lk 9:23-26. New path of life
- Grace trains us to life self-controlled, upright & godly lives 1 Cor 10:31
 - Grace trains us to be self-controlled (Tit 1:8; 2:2, 4,5,6)
 - Grace trains us to be live righteously (upright)
 - Grace trains us to live godly lives, not Tit 1:16

Grace trains us to live godly by looking ahead & behind

13-14a

- Look ahead to the blessed hope of Christ's 2nd Coming 13
 Christ's return will either be a joy or a terrifying judgment!
 By looking for Christ's return we will purify ourselves 1 Jn 3:2-3
- Look back to the power of the Cross of Christ 14a
 - Christ came to redeem us from lawlessness Rom 6:5-14
 - Christ came to purify for Himself a people Rom 6:15-22
- Grace trains us to be ZEALOUS for Good Works! 1 Cor 6:19

14b

Discuss:

- What is the biggest problem in the modern Christian church:
 - Legalism or Licentiousness? Why?
- How can we protect against legalism and/or licentiousness?
- Is it legalistic to go against your feelings in order to deny ungodly impulses?
- How can you obey from your heart if your heart seems to tug you towards sin?
- God's grace in saving sinners is completely unmerited and so Christians are to live by grace; BUT blessing in the Christian life is often contingent upon obedience. Explain how you can reconcile these two principles.
- What would you recommend to a "professor" who has lost his zeal for the Lord and the Lord's work? How can he rekindle his zeal?
- How have you lived your life differently today as a result of the Gospel?
- How can the previous question help us keep our life focused (1 Cor 6:19-20)?
