Gospel Truths to Remember Every Moment

- God is Great so we don't have to be in control
- God is Glorious so we do not have to fear others
- God is Good so we don't have to look elsewhere
- God is Gracious so we don't have to prove ourselves

if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good - 1 Pet 2:3

God is GOOD - so I don't have to look elsewhere...

- Story of God: Adam & Eve doubted God's goodness (Gen 3:1-7)
- They believed the lie, "God is not good and He's holding out on you..."
- Since the Fall, we've like Adam, sought to hide from God and clothe ourselves to make ourselves acceptable to God.
- God is Good in the face of rebellion God promised a Savior (Gen 3:15)
- God is Good He provides us with good things & comforts.
- We often pervert them and seek fulfillment in them rather than God alone

Looking for fulfillment in anything but God is idolatry

- We too often live in the moment and not for God's eternity
- · Marriage; family; work; security; pleasure all good things from God... except...
- "if you look for satisfaction, fulfillment or identity in anything other than Jesus you will be left most empty!"
- We often lose sight of this: consider Psa 73:1-3;21-28 or Psalm 103
- We often worship things that satisfy, rather than God Jn 4 woman @ Well
- Jesus: worship is not about location but an attitude of the heart Jn 4:24
- It is saying: "My God is Good I don't need to look elsewhere for..."

Four Areas from which we pick our idols:

- Comfort; Approval; Control; Power
- Our hearts are idols factories we often worship anything but God

So what are we to do? REPENT & REJOICE

- Repent realize your idols are weak & will never satisfy.
 - · recognize when you use others & things for your own end!
 - my idolatry does more than break God's law, it breaks His heart!
 - Just remember the cost of the Gospel: Rm 5:8; 8:32 to God!
- Rejoice in the reality of the Gospel: Eph 1:6; 1 Jn 3:16
 - replace your idolatry & sin with a greater love identity in Christ!
 - Rejoice like Paul: Rm 8:31-39

To Think About:

- Practice: "God is Great so I don't have to be in control." Pick 1 or more verses to memorize that remind you of this.
- Practice: "God is Glorious so I don't have to fear others." Pick 1 or more verses to memorize that remind you of this.
- Practice: "God is Good so I don't have to look elsewhere for satisfaction."
 Pick 1 or more verses to memorize that remind you of this truth!
- At the end of each day this week, stop and ask yourself if you something or someone became more glorious than the truth of the Gospel? Look for the idols of comfort, approval, control, and power.
- Practice using the 4 Gospel questions when reading your Bible:
 - 1) Who is God?
 - 2) What has He done?
 - 3) Who am I in light of God's work?
 - 4) How should I live in light of this? What if I believed God?
- Practice sharing these Gospel truths with others be transparent and willing to say things like: "Wow, I was not treasuring Christ... I was... but then I realized that God is Good and I don't have look elsewhere for my satisfaction!"

Four Areas to look for Idols:

Idol Area:	Comfort	Approval	Control	Power
What I seek:	my privacy; a lack of stress; my freedom	affirmation; love; relationship	discipline; certainty; standards	I must win, have influence
What I'm willing to pay:	reduced productivity; isolation - because others are messy	less independence (don't like to be alone); being manipulated	lack of spontaneity	burdened, responsible, feeling it is all up to me
What I fear:	stress, other's demands, responsibility	rejection; criticism	uncertainty; things beyond our control	humiliation, lack of respect, incompetence
Problem emotion:	boredom (rarely take risks, we hold back, safety over freedom)	cowardice (we won't tell the whole truth)	worry & anxiety (because we can't control everything)	anger (because people get in the way)
