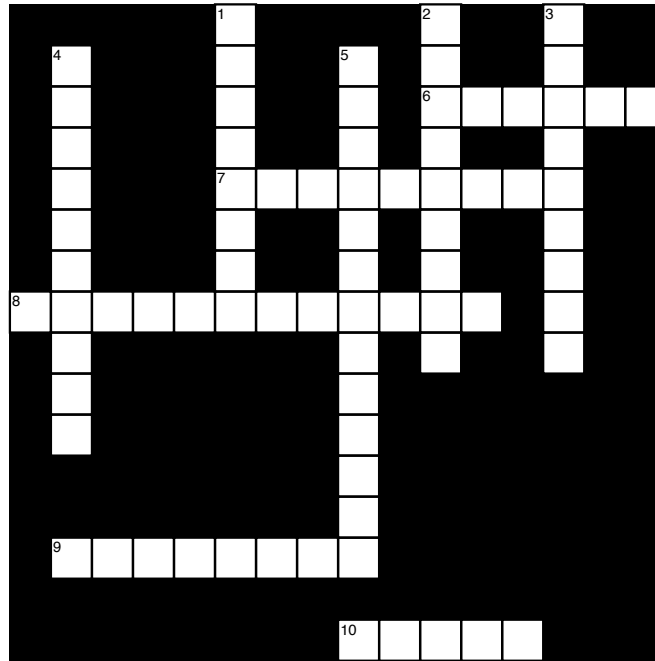
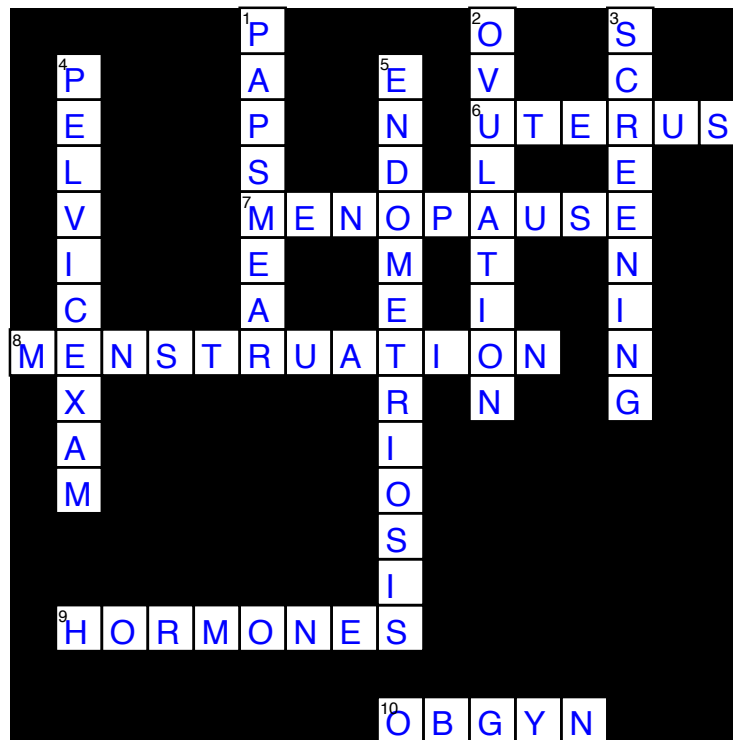


Women's Health



- Across**
- 6 also called the womb, this is a hollow, pear-shaped organ located in a woman's lower abdomen, between the bladder and the rectum
 - 7 end of menstruation; commonly used to refer to the period ending the female reproductive phase of life
 - 8 a cyclical process of the endometrium shedding its lining, along with discharge from the cervix and vagina, from the vaginal opening
 - 9 chemical substances created by the body that control numerous body functions
 - 10 a doctor (abbreviation) who specializes in general women's medical care, diagnosis, and treatment of disorders of the female reproductive system, and care of pregnant women

- 1 a test that involves microscopic examination of cells collected from the cervix, used to detect changes that may be cancer or may lead to cancer, and to show noncancerous conditions, such as infection or inflammation (2 Words)
 - 2 release of a mature egg from an ovary
 - 3 checking for disease when there are no symptoms
 - 4 an internal examination of the uterus, vagina, ovaries, fallopian tubes, bladder, and rectum (2 Words)
 - 5 condition in which tissue resembling that of the endometrium grows outside the uterus, on or near the ovaries or fallopian tubes, or in other areas of the pelvic cavity
