


Mr. K's favorite moment: The joy of receiving a train set from his Economics class two years ago.


Mr. K's future plans: Working on the many court cases for the newly elected Judge Zieba.


When asked if he will miss Avon High School, he replied, "Absolutely! It's hard to forget twenty-nine years of your life!"


Throughout the year, the various classes do many different things. In US History, every junior knows that a movie coupled





During Spirit Week!





Entertainment for the evening included skits and singing. Although many present in the audience knew little or no French and Spanish, the skits were presented in such a way that anyone could understand. It was fun!






Avon's Girls Thrill Crowds East to West





Varsity Boys Give It Their All!



Boys' & Girls' Track Make AHS Proud


















The varsity team finished the season with a record of 8-13. Their season ended when they lost the second game of a double-header in the tournaments.

with a commendable record. These fine boys will soon become Avon's varsity baseball team. Good luck and good job to all!










Wrestlemania!


Co-Captain Rob Wenzler--"Through the eyes of the beholder you may pursue anything if you put your mind to it."

Bowling Adds Fun & Excitement After School




To Be a Senior . . .
