

#### WILLIAM JACOB DURLING

On December 29, 1952, Clearview Schools lost a great leader and a trusted friend. William Jacob Durling, who served Clearview for the past 27 years, passed on.

Coming to Clearview in 1925, with the enrollment being 210, Mr. Durling began his long and tedious job of enlarging and improving the schools. In 1927, a six room addition was built and in 1931, under his direction, a gym-auditorium, a new cafeteria, a shop and a number of other facilities were added.

William Durling had great dreams of building a new and more modern elementary school. So in 1952, construction began on one of the most modern buildings in Lorain County.

This man could be seen walking through the halls of Clearview with a ready smile on his face, never too busy to stop and chat with the students.

A few years ago when being considered for the post of superintendent of Lorain Schools, Mr. Durling expressed his feelings about Clearview in this way: "I feel highly honored to think that I could be considered for such a high position in a fine community like Lorain. But I feel at this time that I am well satisfied with my duties at Clearview, because we operate in this district like a small family — and that's the way I like it."

We all know that William Jacob Durling devoted his life to the expansion and perfection of the Clearview Schools.

The memories of the man, "who did so much for so many with so little" lives in our hearts.

Mrs. VanWagnen and Shirley Mason keep the elementary building going. Mrs. VanWagnen has her hands occupied with some 495 elementary students.





The cooks, janitors and the "clean up" boys are also a main part of our school system. Without their endless effort to keep everything in working order the entire school would be at a standstill.


The clean up boys deserve a lot of recognition for the work that they do. They clean the corridors, rooms and rest rooms nightly.


Years will come and years will go, but we shall always remember good old C.H.S. and it shall remember us.
