Avon, a Social Community, Has Many Clubs and Organizations

AVON -- If you're the type who likes to "join," the City of Avon has much to offer you. To begin with, there are six churches in the community, and each has its groups.

The churches include St. Mary's, Holy Trinity, both Roman Catholic; Avon Methodist, Avon Baptist, Avon Faith Lutheran, and the Avon Church of God. The latter is the most recent addition.

Both St. Mary's and Holy Trinity have Holy Name Societies, while St. Mary's has its Altar-Rosary Society and Holy Trinity has its Ladies Guild. Then there is the Catholic Youth Organization for the youngsters, while the Avon Methodist Church has its Couples Club, the WSCS, and the Youth Fellowship. The Faith Lutheran Church has its women's group, as well as other organizations, and the Baptist Church has its Women's Missionary group and young people's groups, among others.

There is also the Knights of St. John Auxiliary, and the Knights of Columbus and its Isabella Guild.

Parents have formed parent-teacher groups, and there is the Parent-Teacher Units for the Catholic schools, and the Parent-Teacher Associations for the public schools.

Newest of the groups in the community is the Avon Chamber of Commerce, being organized a little more than a year after the Junior Chamber of Commerce. There is also the Lions Club, the Little League, the Chess Club, the Research Club, the Junior

Women's Club, the TOPS Club for weight-watchers, the Friends of the Library, the Historical Society, the Kindergarten Mothers Club, Northgate Swim Club, the Avon Women's Club, and the Avon Businessmen's Association.

Not to be forgotten are the all-important 4-H Clubs, Girl Scout Troops and Boy Scout and Cub Scout Troops. There

is also the Newcomers Club, Civil Defense, and VFW Post 7035 and its Ladies Auxiliary. For the sports-minded there are the French Creek Bowmen and the Avon Sportsmen's Club.

Then there are card clubs, bowling groups, sewing circles and baseball teams.

Myers Model Museum to Amaze Viewers

Avon -- H. J. Myers of Port Clinton, Ohio, will bring his collection of hand-made replicas appraised at a worth in excess of \$75,000 to Avon for the Sesquicentennial Celebration.

The collection, amassed over the past 30 years, includes hand-carved replicas of American transportation -- hotrods of the Gay '90's.

Reported to be the world's

largest collection of hand-carved models, Myers has over 100 carved harnessed horses with circus wagons, exact replicas of Ringling Brothers Circus vehicles, farm wagons, surries, buggies, Mississippi River boats, covered wagons and other vehicles.

This will be the first showing in Lorain County.
