## PCD proposed for southwest section

Though construction has yet to begin on North Ridgeville's first Planned Community Development, Kingston Place, on May 23, the Planning Commission heard an "informational briefing" on a second PCD, Waterbury, which is being proposed for the southwest section of the city.

Edward W. Surovi, project director for Forest City Land Group, said that the company has approximately 640 acres under contract, at North Ridgeville's western corporate limit, between Sugar Ridge Road and Chestnut Ridge Road.

Surovi said that 142 acres have been planned as open space with 578 standard single lots of 70 feet to 80 feet wide. Another 222 acres will be cluster homes, either attached or detached, and 28 acres will be earmarked for neighborhood businesses. Surovi said that there are no definite plans on the types of businesses, but a day care center and restaurant

may be included. If there is no interest in establishing businesses, that section could be converted to residential, said Surovi.

In addition, a six-acre school site may be donated to the North Ridgeville City Schools, if the school population requires the space. A recreation area with a club house and swimming pool is being planned as part of the second or third phase of Waterbury. "Several areas will have walking trails," said Surovi. The PCD is expected to be developed over 10 to 15 years, he said.

Eric Kramer of Donald G. Bohning and Associates, Inc., a civil engineering and surveying firm from Valley View, explained the road system planned for Waterbury, which will include widening streets, "consistent with the city's plan for wider roadways."

There will be more public access to the Shady Drive

## DiFranco and Light inducted into Hall of Fame

Alumni Robert DiFranco and LuAnn Light were inducted into the North Ridgeville High School Distinguished Alumni Hall of Fame on May 25, after being selected by the Academic Recognition Committee.

DiFranco graduated in 1964 where he was a star athlete in football and basketball. In 1969 he graduated from Ashland University where he played football, and in 1972 he received a masters degree from the University of Akron.

He taught school for 31 years, 29 at North Ridgeville High School as a business education teacher. He also was freshman class advisor for two years, and served as athletic director five years, as well as a football and basketball coach.

DiFranco coached football and basketball at Midview Middle School, and was scorekeeper for the varsity basketball team at Midview High.

He was tournament manager for district softball in Division I and Division III in North Ridgeville and also was a member of the Grafton Parks and Recreation Department.

Accepting the award on behalf of his late father and the

DiFranco family, Troy DiFranco, his voice trembling with emotion, told the students, "he loved all you guys."

Troy DiFranco said his father enjoyed the students and though in his 31st year of teaching when he died, he never talked of retiring.

Bob DiFranco's philosophy on grading was to judge a student on the effort he or she put into the class. "As long as a student made the effort, he deserved the grade," he said.

Heather DiFranco said her father had taught her many things as she grew up. "He made me realize what was and wasn't important," she said, and cited

the time she "crashed" the car, and Bob DiFranco's main concern was "Heather, are you O.K.?" Heather DiFranco created a ripple of laughter from the audience when she admitted that she "crashed again," and even a third time, adding, "I still don't really think it was my fault."

She said her father instilled in her a belief that she could do whatever she wanted to do.

LuAnn Light graduated in 1976. She was vice-president and secretary of the Mentor Headlands Pre-School Parent Teacher co-op and was a leader for Brownie and Girls Scout troops.

Her volunteer work includes involvement with special education, Special Olympics and North Ridgeville peewee football cheerleaders and girls softball.

While on the Wilcox Elementary PTA, Light chaired the carnival and created the Secret Santa Workshop. At the high school she serves on the Academic Recognition Committee, the Parents of the Class of 2000 and Band Boosters.

She serves as good will ambassador for the United States in its participation in Project Children which brings children from Northern Ireland to the United States.

Light is employed as a classroom and library aide and as a secretary for North Ridgeville City Schools.

Though her husband was unable to attend the induction, he sent a note in which he thanked his wife "for all she has done."

In accepting her honor, Light said, "I have only done what others have done...it's a wonderful feeling to do something I enjoy doing."

She concluded by saying that she was honored to be receiving the same award as Bob DiFranco, "a man I admired."



# Martinez sentenced to nine years, three months

Tammy Martinez was sentenced to nine years and three months in prison on Thursday. Martinez, 41, pleaded guilty to charges that she attempted to hire a hit man to kill her husband, Ruben Martinez.

The Cornell Boulevard resident was arrested after she was videotaped by the North Ridgeville police on Dec. 23 when she met with an undercover police detective and promised to pay \$5,000 to have her husband killed.

She apparently had expected to receive \$100,000 in insurance money after her husband's death.

According to news accounts, Tammy Martinez wanted to have her husband killed so she would not have to deal with an adult stepdaughter.

The woman was convicted of conspiracy to commit aggravated murder, two counts of obstructing justice, one count of tampering with evidence and one count of insurance fraud.

Common Pleas Judge Mark Betleski handed down the Martinez sentence on Thursday. She was remanded to the Ohio Reformatory for Women in Marysville. She will be given credit against her sentence for the time she has spent in jail.

Commenting on the resolution of the case, Captain Richard Thomas of North Ridgeville Police Department said he is "glad to see her off the streets," though admitted he was surprised that the sentence was not stiffer considering the number of charges involved. "He (Betleski) must have had reasons for what he did," said Thomas.

The police captain said that he has no doubt that "had we not intervened, we would have been investigating a homicide."

Explaining the sentence, Betleski said that, based on the charges against Martinez, he could have had four different trials. However, in reviewing the factors involved,

including that this was a first time felony for Tammy Martinez and that since July, 1996, applicable sentences are to be served concurrently, he felt it best not to have four separate trials. Prior to the 1996 statute, sentences were served consecutively, which in the Martinez case, could have added up to around 30 years, he said.

Betleski said that through the Martinez guilty plea, "we were able to convince someone to admit they had done wrong," which will also allow the family to move on.

"Sentencing and sending off is the first step in rehabilitation," he said.

## NR to get water taps from new 40-inch main

Help is on the way for the water shortage that plagues the northwest section of the city, according to City Engineer Stewart Lovece.

Last week Lovece told the Utilities Committee that a 42-inch water line is being planned that will travel from Avon Lake through North Ridgeville, on its way to Medina County, and will provide three taps in Ridgeville - one near the north corporation line, another at Center Ridge Road and a third at Chestnut Ridge. The taps which cost \$60,000, each will be installed at no cost to North Ridgeville.

Lovece said that the city will also realize some road paving, as well, in the areas where the water line is installed.

"Medina has a need for water," he said, "but the line will also strengthen that whole section of the city (North Ridgeville)."

Presently if there is a water line break west of the water tower, said Lovece, "the whole west end goes out." However, the engineer was quick to stress, "adding the main doesn't mean we don't need the water tower."

Lovece stated that the contract bid for the new main is \$22 million, however, Rick Eberle, assistant director of Avon Lake Utilities Department, declined to quote a price for the line which will cover 25 miles from Avon Lake to Medina, because bids are scheduled to be opened Friday.

Though Avon Lake will oversee the project, Eberle said it is a joint venture between Avon Lake, the Rural Lorain

County Water Authority, Medina County and the City of Medina.

"We anticipate the actual pipe installation to begin mid-July," he said, and will be handled through four contracts.

The majority of the line going through Ridgeville will be in easements, he said, "there will be very little in actual city right-of-ways."

Eberle explained that route will be on the city's west side, with a portion on Barres to Race, south on Race, and eventually to Rt. 83, where it will continue south.

Although six years ago, a 30-inch water line was constructed along Lear Nagle, Eberle said the development in communities such as Avon and North Ridgeville has been "incredible." The taps, he said, will enhance the future growth of those cities.

"When North Ridgeville and Avon want to use it (line), they will sign a contract of participation," he said.

## A view from the Hill...

A View from the Hill, has not appeared for several months because I was told that due to the November election, the column would not be printed. I received a call a few weeks ago asking if I would be interested in again writing the monthly column. Of course, I agreed since it is an opportunity to share information with you about our city.

Some misunderstandings continue regarding Planned Community Developments, managed growth and the petition that was circulated. The petition has often been touted as a petition to permit a vote on Planned Community Developments. To clarify, the petition was not to submit Planned Developments or the Kingston Place development between Case and Stony Ridge Roads to a vote of electors. Per our Charter, the peti-

tion refers a matter to Council. If Council rescinds its vote on an issue, the pertinent issue is not placed on the ballot. Council voted to rescind the action. The Charter specifies that, "If Council fails to repeal said Ordinance or resolution...Council shall submit it to a vote of the electors..."

In an effort to better inform our citizens about open space development and managed growth, we have scheduled a Town Meeting for June 15 from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. at the Education Center on Mills Creek Lane (near Dairy Queen on Center Ridge Road). More details will be forthcoming. It is our sincere hope that you can share in this educational forum as we plan for our future together. In the meantime, if you wish to discuss the issue with Safety-Service Director Jim Johnson, please feel free to call at 353-0812. He is more than happy to meet with individuals or neighborhood groups.

A grant funded installation of traffic signals on Center Ridge Road. The new signals did improve flow, but one of the remaining concerns has been the lack of adequate turning arrows at the intersection of Center Ridge and Avon Belden. Because it was a grant that funded the signalization, any change must be precipitated by a traffic study and final approval from the state. Following that, money must be allocated locally. Council has the authority to legislate and allocate funds. The administration has the responsibility to oversee operations and the work of city departments. By

working together, we hope to soon improve the flow at the intersection.

Bainbridge Road reconstruction is finally back on track. Bainbridge is open to two-way traffic from St. Route 83 to Root Road. The remainder of Bainbridge is open to east-bound traffic only for approximately three months. The entire project is scheduled to be completed by mid-October. Over 80 percent (\$3.2 million) of the cost is funded by the federal government.

The construction of the new water tower will soon begin. Subject to City Council approval of funding, the administration's intentions are to construct offices inside the tower. The expansion of City Hall six years ago was built to serve office needs for five years. We will review costs, layouts and the assignment of office space following construction of the tower.

Construction will begin this summer on the 42-inch diameter water transmission main to Medina County by the Rural Water Authority. The Rural Water Authority has the legal right, as determined by the State of Ohio, to run the main through our city. They will be providing three taps to us, which will enhance the performance and reliability of our water distribution system, especially along the western portion of our city.

## Trip to regional airport highlights alliance meeting

It's "gear down, flaps down" as the Lorain County Community Alliance (LCCA) is on final approach for its next regularly scheduled meeting today (Wednesday) at Lorain County Regional Airport, 44050 Russia Rd., in New Russia Township.

The meeting will mark only the second time the LCCA has met outside the Lorain County Administration building. "The Alliance members recognize that it's easier for some of the county's elected officials to meet in the evening. This will be a great opportunity for many of those folks to see that the LCCA listened, and, thanks to air-

port management, is offering them a chance to see the airport up close and personal," said LCC Administrative Coordinator Mike Whitmore.

The meeting will begin with tour of the much-publicized facility beginning at 5 p.m. A bus from Lorain County Transit will provide the shuttle service. The Alliance will get down to business at 6 p.m. with a presentation by Airport Director Michael Barth.

Much has happened to the airport over the last two years, including the purchase of the Fixed Based Operations by the county and the installation of a

new airport authority. Barth will give an overview of airport operations and tell, in his view, what the future may hold for the county's only major air transport link.

"We're happy to be able to offer opportunities for people to come to the airport outside of our special events. With the Alliance meeting, the public and the county's elected officials as a group can come to the facility to network and see what they've heard about for so long," Barth said.

In addition to learning about the airport, the LCCA will welcome three new governmental and two new associate members. Since

a business meeting was unable to be held April 7, the Alliance will recognize the city of Avon, Sheffield Village, Wellington Village and Sheffield Township as governmental members. With the addition of the French Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant and the Lorain County Community Development, LCCA Association membership has grown to 15.

The LCCA continues to work on the railroad and there will be a status report on the issues surrounding the year-old purchase of Conrail by the Norfolk Southern and CSX rail lines. Statewide criteria is still being drafted that will

allow communities to tap Ohio's \$200 million Grade separation Program. It is also hoped that NOACA will be close to completing a prioritization of Lorain County's railroad crossings, showing which areas are in greatest need of an under/overpass. The LCCA is paying the \$1,500 cost of the study.

The first Lorain County Community Summit will be held Oct. 11 at Lorain County Community College and the LCCA will hear how planning is progressing for the event.

All meetings of the LCCA are free and open to the public.

Complex, said Kramer, which would eliminate access off Shady Drive. There will also be access to Chestnut Ridge and two accesses to Bender. There is also a parcel of land in the middle of the development which will divide the PCD, because, at this time, the owner does not want to sell the property. However, Surovi said that streets will be stubbed at

the parcel, in the event the owner decides to sell in the future. Several lakes in the PCD will provide "storm water management," said Kramer, and enhance the site, as well.

In the interest of being a good neighbor, a green corridor will be created to buffer the abutting Lexington Way development, which runs off Sugar Ridge Road, he said.

Replying to a question from Planning Commission Chairman Ron Schwachenwald, Kramer said that the timetable for Phase 1 will depend on the market, with plans calling for constructing 100 units at a time.

The unique part of the PCD, said Kramer, is that "it allows for a broad range of housing products," which means the lots could be 70, 75 or 80 feet wide. The housing will be not seg-

regated and will permit various types of houses to intermingle.

Sugar Ridge Road resident Nancy Franks expressed disappointment that the proposed lots are not bigger. She said that many parcels on Sugar Ridge and Chestnut Ridge are wider than 70 feet, adding that the lots in Lexington Way are five acres. "Maybe some people want more space," she said.

Kramer said, "there is the potential to be estate size." He also said he appreciated the input, adding, "Everyone's suggestions will be looked at."

He also said water and sewer will be supplied to the PCD. No date has been set for presenting the proposal to the Planning Commission for preliminary approval.

## And how do you spell it?

Avon resident George Bliss told North Ridgeville's Planning Commission last week that for years North Ridgeville has been spelling Lear Nagle incorrectly. Bliss said that Avon spells it 'Nagel,' while Ridgeville insists it's 'Nagle.'

Who's right? According to Bliss, Nagel Road got its name from the Nagel family, who are direct descendants of Jacob Nagel who came to Avon from Germany in 1812.

To further prove his point, in a letter to Lorain County Engineer Kenneth Carney, Bliss said, "the driveway south of Detroit Road (formerly North Ridge Road) to his log cabin house was known as Nagel's Lane until it was continued on past his house further south."

It became Lear Road in Avon Lake, named for a Mr. Lear who settled in Avon Lake around the same time that Jacob Nagel arrived. Going south, the

road combined the names in deference to both families, said Bliss. "However, something has happened in North Ridgeville," he said, because all the street signs in North Ridgeville except on the North Ridgeville side of Mills and Nagel are misspelled, all the way to Lorain Road.

The county map is wrong, as is the AAA map of Northeast Ohio, said Bliss, and quoted Dale Carnegie who said, "A man's name is to him, the sweetest and most important sound in any language."

The Avon resident said he hoped the spelling could be corrected.

In a letter to the Planning Commission, City Engineer Stewart Lovece said that if the panel desires, the road can be renamed according to ordinance, but during the meeting Lovece quipped, "I always wondered about that, but I always thought Avon was wrong."

The Planning Commission voted to change the spelling.
