
Cross Country Runs Toward Success
























With all the returning experience, the girls' tennis team can look forward to a strong and successful fall of 1985.





Hardworking Steelmen








J.V. Season: A Bright







Frosh Roundballers






Varsity Baseball Look












Hi-Standard Returns To LHS


