Butkowskis take pride in Corn Festival

Twenty-nine years ago, John and Bernadine Butkowski discovered an event that would bring a community together-the North Ridgeville Corn Festival.

John, who is vice president of Power Services for Orius Central Office Services Group in Amherst, spearheaded the event because as a requirement of North Ridgeville becoming a Bicentennial Community, the city needed to host an event that would bring together a community.

After the Bicentennial, we decided to continue the festival and it has grown to what we have today-a chance for the community to have a reason to get together and have a good time," John said. "I believe that the recipe for the festival's success is free admission, free parking and free entertainment.'

His wife agrees.

"Entertainment, food and fun. Every day there is great entertainment for all ages-music, car shows and special demonstrations," she said. "It's a great weekend for the entire city.'

John, who grew up in Lorain, refers to the Corn Festival as a "homecoming of sorts" as college students meet their former North Ridgeville classmates and students on vacation for the summer meet the friends they made during the school year. Additionally, it draws the entire community together for one weekend during the year, he said.

Bernadine, who moved to North Ridgeville when she was 2 years old, said she enjoys hearing stories about what is happening in her friends' lives

A tour director with Great Day Tours, Bernadine said their children, Pamela who resides in Redondo Beach, Calif. and Bob who lives in Chillicothe, grew up with the festival and have fond memories of the event. She too has great recollections of the people that she has met and worked with over the years.

'I look forward to the festival each year to meet old friends and make new ones," she said.

John and Bernadine both have been pleased that over the past years the Corn Festival has received local recognition.

'I was pleased that all of the hard work over the years by the festival committee was recognized (in Cleveland Magazine) and was elated that the Corn Festival was the vehicle that helped publicize the City of North Ridgeville," John said.

Aside from taking part in the Corn Festival, the Butkowskis find satisfaction in helping people solve problems.

School board takes first step toward November ballot

There is no final decision on whether or not the North Ridgeville City Schools will put a levy on the November ballot, however during the July 29 work session the school board passed a resolution of necessity. It also requested that the state tax commissioner estimate the rate needed to generate \$2.4 million, through both a property tax and an income tax.

Another voice was heard on a proposed school levy last week when Behm Drive resident Jim Snyder joined the discussion on whether to put an issue on the November ballot.

Labeling himself "Mr. Average

Taxpayer," Snyder alerted board members that in talking to other residents he ... \$2.4 million to continue the quality prolearned they feel a levy was passed not long ago, however they forget it was a renewal.

We thought we had a surplus of \$1 million to the good," he said.

Snyder, a lifelong North Ridgeville resident, told the board that of the two options his choice would be the income tax, though he admitted his fear is "once you give it, you've lost control."

He also promised if they prove to him the district needs the money, "I'll be right there with you. I would go along with an income tax."

Superintendent Larry Bowersox said

the North Ridgeville City Schools need grams that are presently in place, stressing the district has suffered state cuts while anticipating extensive growth over the next several years, due to the large number of housing units under construction in the city.

Bowersox asked board members whether an income or a property tax would be the way to go.

"I think we have a better chance of passing an income tax," Ross Mitchell, school board vice-president said.

However, Tom Dake questioned the \$2.4 million figure and where the money will be spent.


Bowersox said the district would have additional costs in a number of areas, including special education, the gifted and talented curriculum, technology updates, increased class sizes and professional development for teachers.

"I think we need to put together a pie chart," Dake said. "We want the community to know how it's spent."

As he has said before, School Treasurer Biagio Sidoti stressed that the levy passed in 1995 was for 9.8 mills and generated \$2.7 million, however during the past seven years, the millage has

Governor honors local company for excellence in exporting

BioPlastics, a North Ridgeville company, was one of 29 Ohio firms honored by Gov. Bob Taft last week in Columbus, and was given the Governor's Excellence in Exporting Award.

The award was established in 1985 and each year the governor presents "E" Awards to organizations of all sizes that have increased their export-related jobs in Ohio or have helped the state's companies achieve success internationally.

BioPlastics has been in been in business since 1977 and moved to its location at 34655 Mills Road in 1986.

"We make plastic-coated belting products," Frank Boron, BioPlastics president said. "We purchase webbing and put the plastic coating on it."

BioThane Belting has a variety of coating classes and thicknesses.

Boron said that three years ago the company had just two distributors outside the United States and today there are 12-14.

"We export to quite a few countries," he said, including the Middle East, India, Puerto Rico, Canada and Scandinavia.

'We have talked to a lot of people," Boron said. "It's a slow process but we're getting there."

Leading the way on a tour of the company, Boron stopped at a large display highlighting the various products they offer, including outdoor, medical, sports and industrial use items. Photos, in what Boron calls the company's "care package," show straps used in backboard restraints, as well as head immobilizer straps and handles and shoulder straps on medical bags.


"We provide football straps," he said. "There are belts and guitar straps, and we've begun selling into the military."

The equine business is a large outlet in the area of tack and harnesses.



Children learn about their senses in a unique way

Every day children and people all over the world use their five senses for a variety of reasons. On July 20, three local children learned what the five senses are and how they use them at the Sandy Ridge Reservation off Otten Road.

Naturalist Tim Fairweather began the program by bringing out his "toolbox." However, this was no ordinary toolbox. This box was filled with what body parts are used when discovering your senses-sight, taste, touch, hear and smell.

During the program, Fairweather told the children what each of their senses is used for and at the end of the session he brought out a turtle. He then told the children what senses the turtle uses for survival.

The Lorain County Metro Parks have been hosting a 'sensory circle" for an estimated 20-30 years. It is geared toward younger children, most commonly those who are in pre-school through second grade.
"The program helps children think about using

their five senses," Fairweather said.

Most of the programs come at the request of an area school. The North Ridgeville Parks and Recreation Center requested the July 30 class.







The festival meant smoothies and Corn Fest lemonade. dunking booth fun. It also meant that a new school year was not far off.


"The festival annually helps the (NRHS) band raise money with the dunking booth and it also helps political candidates meet the people and express their views." Meredith said.





The next portion of the plant houses the quality control part of the company. The company president showed another facet of the operation, the fabrication department where belts are cut and punched.

Picking up a bright orange belt and turning it over in his hands, Boron said that it is a training device for dogs for a customer in Houston.

According to information on the company's website, rolled goods continue to be the basis of the firm's sales,





Local swim team, new coach pleased with fun season

North Ridgeville's Katie Fagan was expecting a typical summer break after her second year at Kent State University. She thought she'd continue her full-time position as a supervisor and lifeguard at the Mills Creek South swimming pool.

Fagan ended up picking up a lot more work at the pool, which resulted in more rewarding ways than she could imagine.

Judith L. Slebodnik, president of the Mills Creek Swim Team (MCST), had to fill a head coaching position void at the last minute for the recreational summer swim team. Slebodnik knew Fagan swam on the MCST for 15 years and served as a lifeguard for the past six years. She called Fagan literally minutes before the team's first scheduled practice and asked her if she'd be interested.

"She called me and said, 'Do you want to coach?" Fagan recalled. "I was like, 'Sure. I'll be over in 10 minutes.'"

Fagan committed herself to the MCST, working nearly three hours a day, five days a week at team practices in the morning, followed by a 10-hour daily lifeguarding shif.

"It was a lot of work," Fagan said. "But it was well worth it. I loved it. I didn't realize how much I missed it until I got to the meets and saw how excited the kids were about competing. I remembered being there myself just a couple of years ago. Hopefully I'll be back next year to coach again.'

MCST has been in existence for over 30 years and competes in the North Coast Swim League (NCSL) along with Amherst, Avon Lake, Bay Village, North Olmsted, Rocky River and Westlake. NCSL teams have an advantage over North Ridgeville because their teams have about twice the amount of swimmers than MCST. They also have the luxury of using the varsity swimmers from their schools. North Ridgeville had just three girls competing in varsity swimming last year. Most

of the opponents also have five or six coaches. Fagan had one assistant, Sarah Myer, to help her this summer.

"We're a neighborhood swim team that is swimming against city swim teams," Fagan said. "It's hard in the meets because we have so many less kids than the other teams do. They all have their high school swimmers. We only had three girls from the high school swim team to use. Westlake and North Olmsted have huge high school swim teams. We have whoever we can collect for the summer team." Despite these obstacles, the MCST

managed to go 2-4 in the regular season. They defeated Rocky River and Bay Village. The win against Rocky River was especially rewarding since they are a strong program and finished second place in the NCSL Championship at the end of

"The kids were so excited because last year they only won one meet," Fagan said. "They were ecstatic to start off the season with a win in the first meet against Rocky River."

MCST finished sixth out of the seven teams in the NCSL Championship, ahead of Bay Village. Brian Drellishak, David Januzzi, Tom Sweeney and Connor Sweeney finished in first-place in the eight and under 100-yard medley relay. Januzzi also finished third in the 25-yard breaststroke. Scott Swartz placed second in the 14 and under 50-yard backstroke. Alvssa Lavalle finished first in the 12 and under 50-yard fly and second in the 50yard free. Alexandra Leach-Wick placed first in the 14 and under 50-yard breaststroke. Taylor Reis finished third in the six and under 25-yard backstroke while Michaela Roherty finished third in the 25vard breaststroke. Sarah Anders finished third in the open 50-yard backstroke.

"Alyssa is one of our best swimmers," Fagan said. "She swims all year round. She's half the size of the other 12 year-olds and she's an amazing swimmer. Alexandra also swims all year round. She's going to be swimming at Magnificat in the fall. This

"That was a great accomplishment for that team to finish with that record," Esterak said.


Esterak is very familiar with NRHS' teams, as he has coached against them several times over the years.

coach, I know this is only





LOCAL & GENERAL **ANESTHESIA**

What's the difference between local and general anesthesia?

For certain procedures, a dentist may give you an anesthetic to completely eliminate pain. A local anesthetic affects only the specific area where the dentist is working. For instance, if the dentist is going to prepare a decayed tooth, he or she will most likely give you, in the tissue near the tooth, a local anesthetic like novocaine or lidocaine. First, a topical anesthetic is applied with a cotton swab to the skin where we intend to make the injection. The topical anesthetic will make the injection more comfortable. After the injection, the area should begin to get numb. For more extensive procedures like oral surgery, a surgeon may elect a general anesthesia, which will cause a temporary loss of consciousness or memory. Before giving you any anesthesia, we should know about any allergies you may have. Dentists have used these techniques to facilitate their work on millions of patients. 
The race is open to participants of all ages. The divisions vary from 14 and under to 70 and over. Awards will be given in both the 10K and 5K races




