COMMERCIAL

Mrs. Gratchen conducted classes in Office Practice, Shorthand I and II, Typing II, Personal Typing, and Notehand. She got her AB from Muskingum. Teaching Typing I and Business Math is Mr. Fairburn. ENGLISH





A parade, bonfire, pep rally, football game and the crowning of a queen were the highlights of Brookside's 1964 Homecoming.


