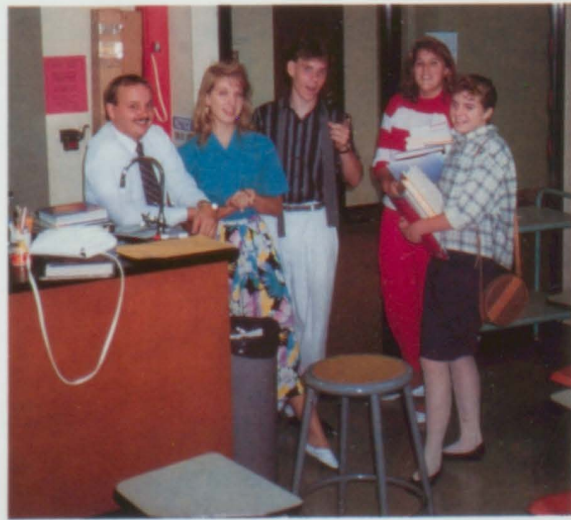

# Memories of a Lasting Time

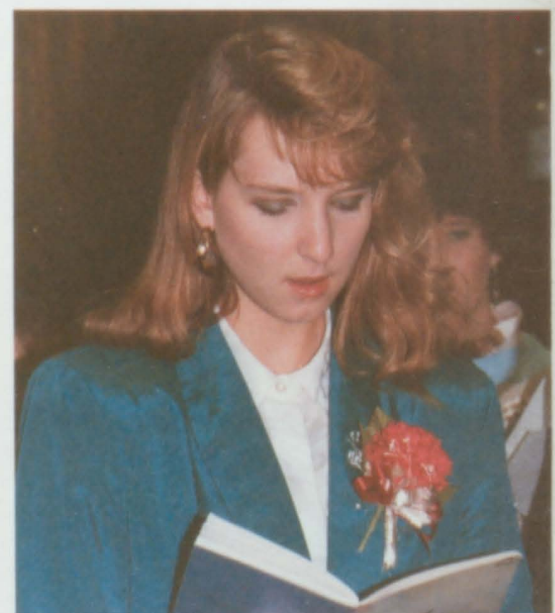

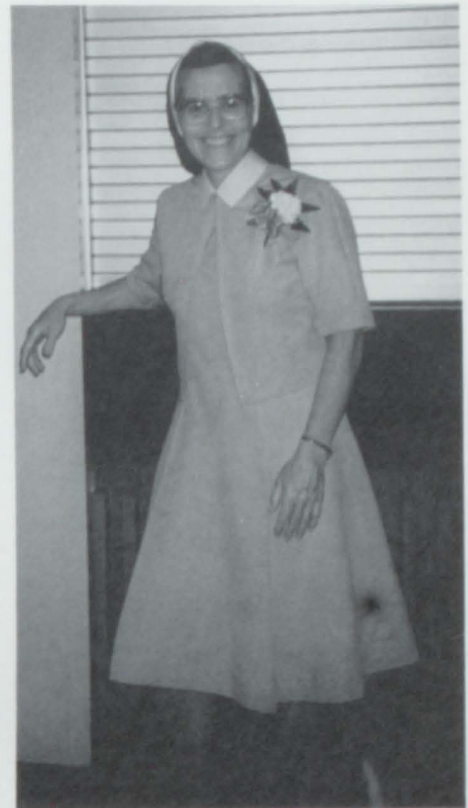






# Meet the Memory Makers

Fr. Leo Dechant, our Chaplain. Besides his 'Chaplain duties', Father also teaches German II and Marriage.

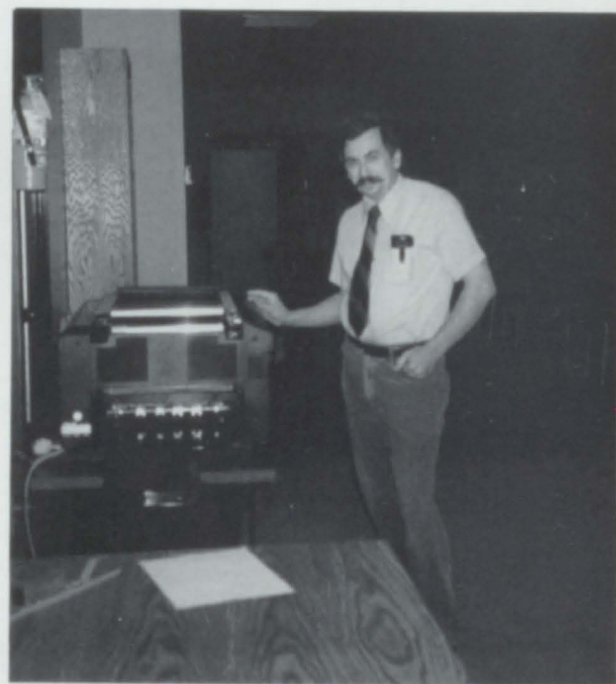

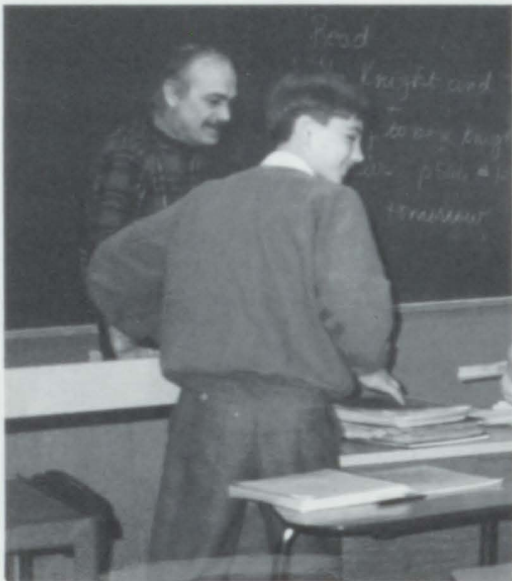

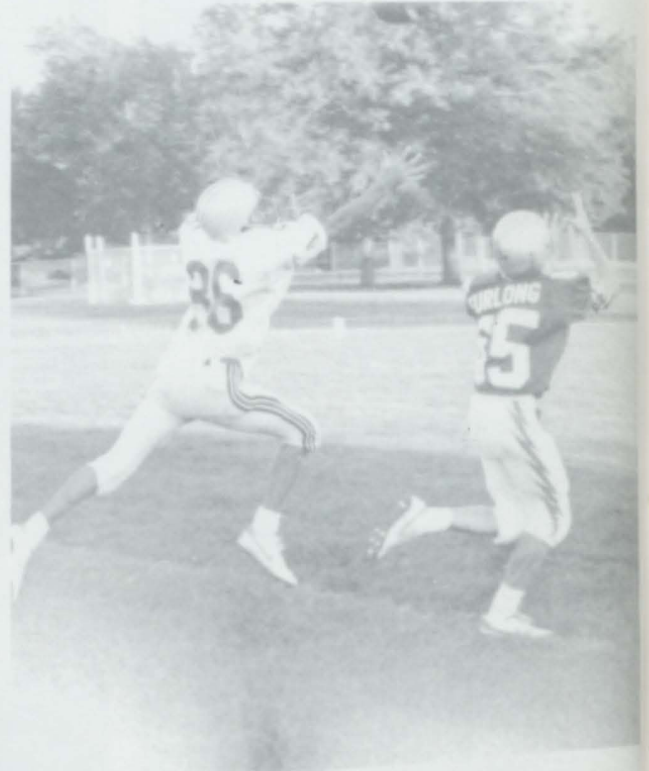

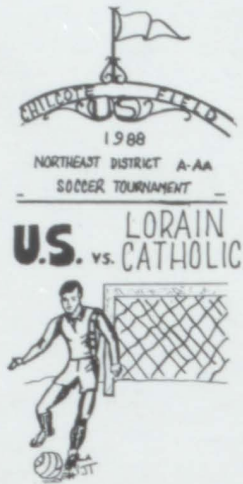

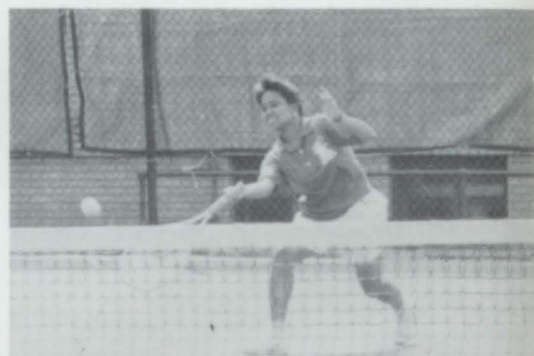

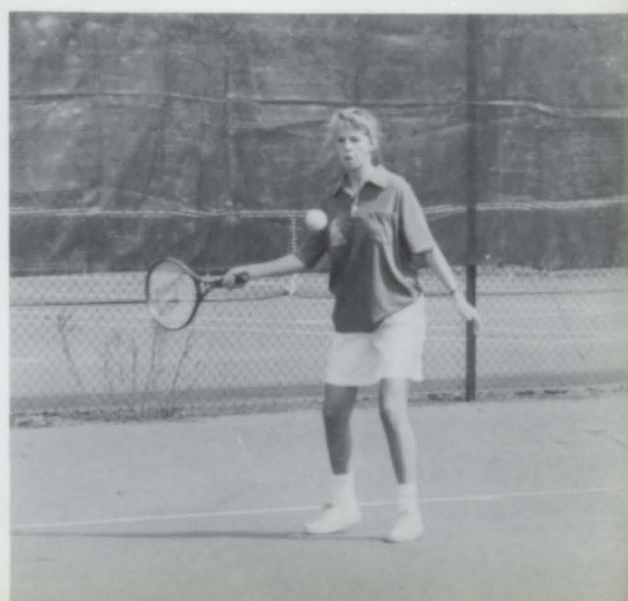

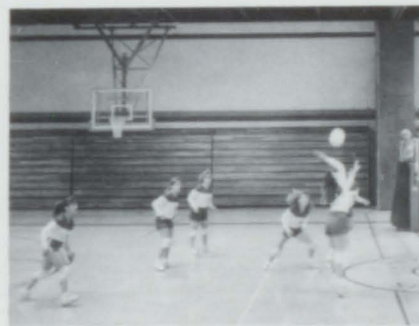

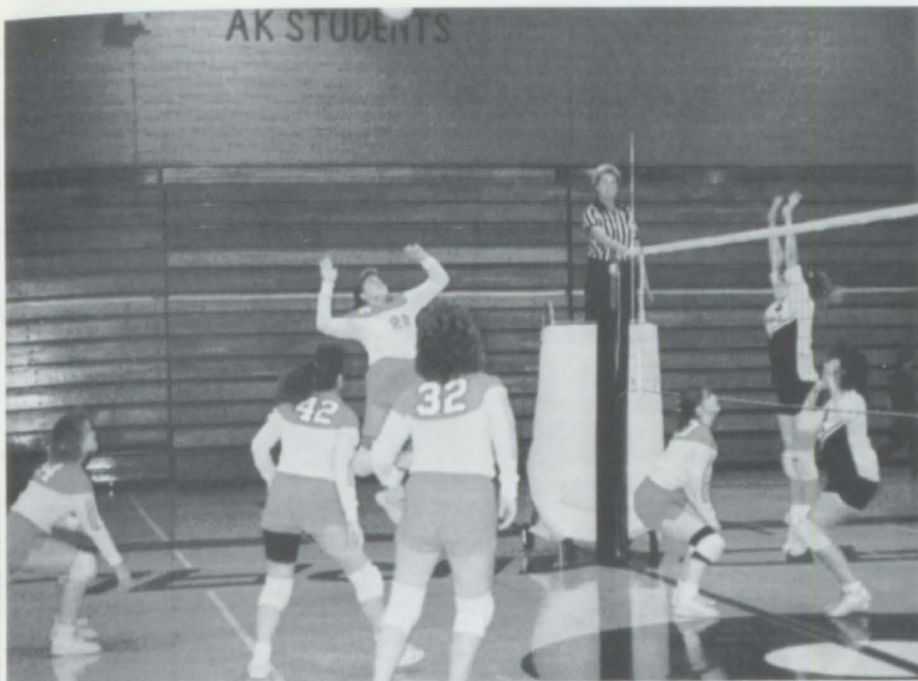

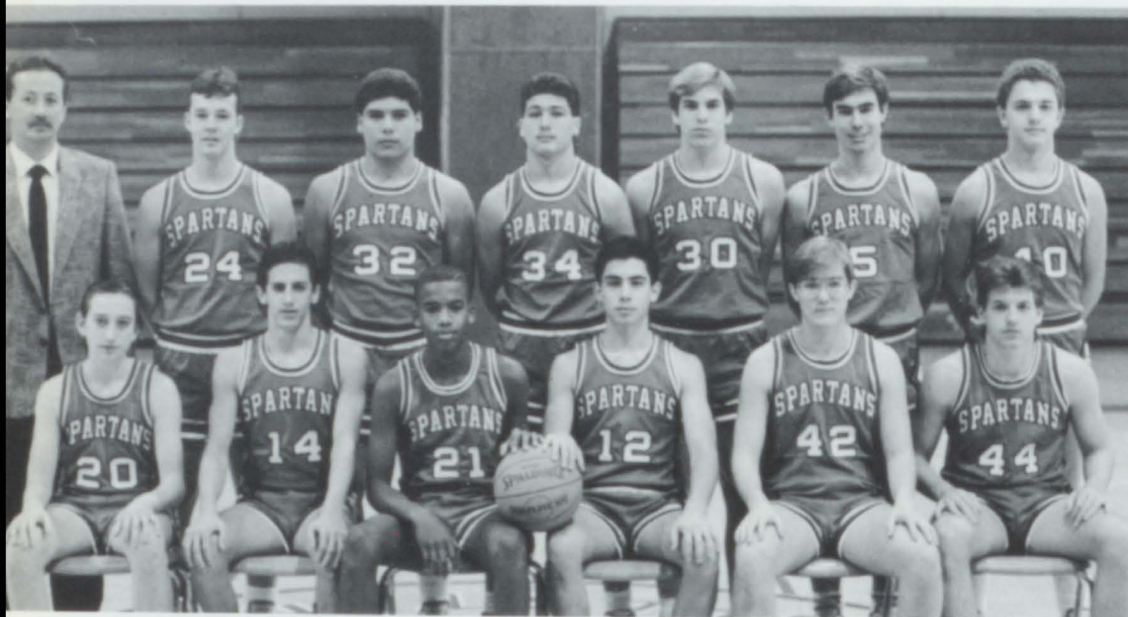

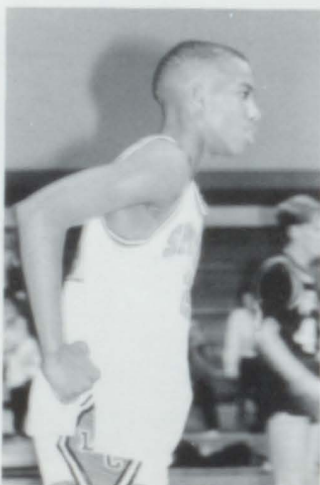

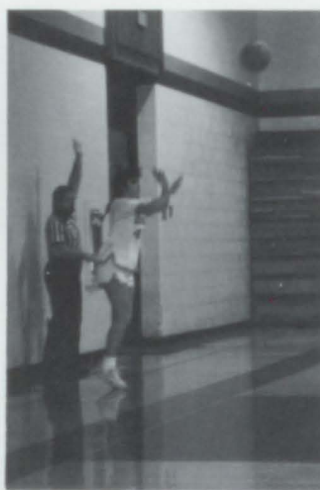

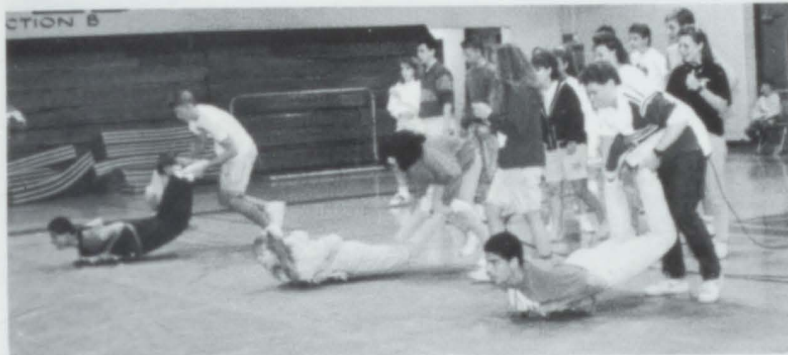

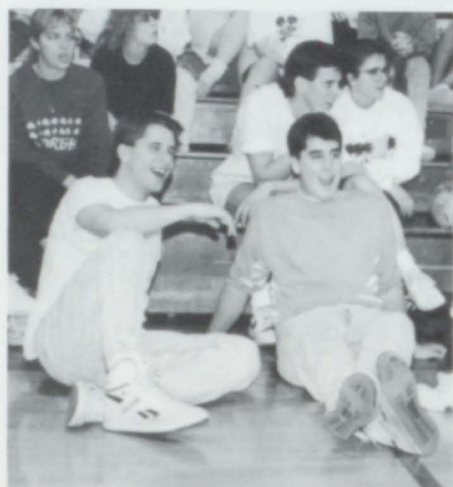

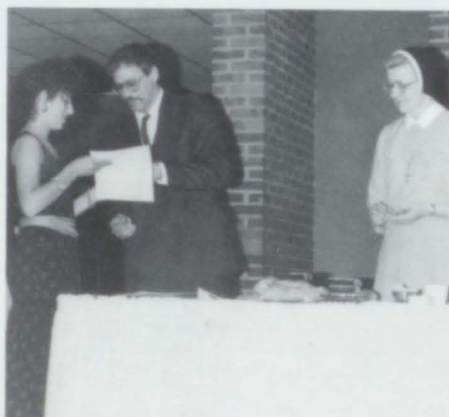
