Battle between Zagrans and Phillips continues

The muscle-flexing between Law Director Eric Zagrans and Avon attorney Gerald Phillips continued during the Nov. 20 Council meeting, when for the second time Phillips, who represents a grassroots group of North Ridgeville residents, had a court reporter ready to take notes on the meeting.

After setting up his equipment, in preparation for the Nov. 6 meeting, Council voted to halt the transcribing. Last week the Law Director told Council that he felt the action was "inappropriate" and that Phillips was preparing a "competing record" of the meeting.

Councilman Larry Overby, D-1, said, "there's a good chance we'll have to pay for this guy being here."

Zagrans noted that on the city's behalf he will "object strenuously" if Phillips adds the court reporter to the bills he is asking the city to pay.

When Councilman David Gillock, at large-R, stressed that the meeting was being filmed by the cable company, Zagrans assured him that "anyone is perfectly free to take notes," however, it seemed that Phillips, by using a court reporter was trying to compete with the official record and was "opening a can of worms that was better left closed."

Councilwoman Bernadine Butkowski, at large-R, said that recently the nation celebrated Veterans Day, and that 25 people from North Ridgeville died for freedom of speech, calling the challenge to the court reporter a "travesty and dishonor" to those who have died for freedom.

Zagrans said, "there is no way we are asking this gentleman not to participate and not to express his views." He went on to explain that the reporter was not being prevented from taking a transcript, nor was his freedom of speech being violated. Following the Law Director's comments, Council voted 5-2 to have the reporter stop. Councilwoman Gail Minnick, R-4 and Butkowski dissented.

During his regular report Zagrans questioned the bills submitted by Phillips, noting that he has "filed an objection to the inflated bills."

The Law Director said that Phillips' bills included \$1,600 for attending four Council meetings; eight one-minute phone calls, for which the attorney billed a minimum of 15 minutes for each; \$3,500 for driving time to Columbus; as well as statements that gave the appearance of Phillips working more than 24 hours per day. "I hope the Court rejects the attor-

Expansion and upgrade of water treatment plant to begin Nov. 30

Mayor Deanna Hill announces the opening of Phase I of the Expansion and Upgrade at the French Creek Wastewater Treatment on Nov. 30.

The City of North Ridgeville, which owns and operates The French Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP), has commenced a \$4.7 million expansion and upgrade to increase the treatment capacity of the wastewater treatment plant from 7.5 MGD to 11.25 MGD. The Ohio Water Development Authority (OWDA), the original owners and builders of the plant, envisioned a 30 MGD plant expandable in phases based on population growth in the service area. The French Creek WWTP serves the City of North Ridgeville, the City of Avon, and the Village of Sheffield.

The opening of Phase I signifies a milestone achievement in the completion of the first expansion of the WWTP since the City of North Ridgeville purchased the plant from OWDA in 1983. Items completed in

Phase I, at a total cost of \$3.3 million, include:

1. Construction of three aerobic digesters, each with a capacity of 1.27 million gallons.
2. Complete rebuilding of 22 sludge-drying beds, totaling 81,000 sq. ft. of filtering surface.
3. Installation of an ultraviolet disinfection system, 22 MGD capacity.

The Ohio EPA approved this plant expansion and upgrade under Permit-to-Install No. 02-13008-M. Funding for the expansion and upgrade is provided by an increase in the sewer rate charges. HB Engineering, Inc. of North Royalton, OH is performing the project engineering and construction management.

Tours of the new facilities and the French Creek WWTP will follow the ceremony.

The media, the public, government officials, industry and contractors are invited to attend the open house to be held from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

'Speak when Bible speaks; silent when Bible is silent'

Following in his father's footsteps and his father before him, Jason Hardin is a preacher and at 21, has been leading the congregation at the North Ridgeville Church of Christ on Chestnut Ridge Road for more than two years.

An Indiana native, Hardin attended Indiana University, but in preparing for his religious calling, Hardin said he spent a year of "intense training" with his father, who has been an evangelist for 26 years. His grandfather, too, was a preacher, he said, and devoted four decades to teaching the word of Jesus in Louisville, Kentucky.

Discussing the message that permeates his preaching Hardin said, "it is very, very simple. We try to look past human tradition and human ideas and go back to the Bible. We speak when the Bible speaks and be silent when the Bible is silent."

The focus Hardin takes to the 75 or 80 people who attend his church, is the Bible - the church of the New Testament.

With the Christmas season at hand, many churches are preparing special services, music and celebrations, but at the Church of Christ, said the preacher, "we do not celebrate Christmas as a religious holiday." This is not to say Hardin ignores the season. "I have no problem giving gifts and putting up a Christmas tree," he said, "but no one knows when Jesus was born. We believe He was born, but if God had wanted us to celebrate the birth, He would have told us when it was."

"We have no Christmas program," he said, adding "there are a lot of things people take for granted," such as the tradition of the Three Wise Men. "We know there were wise men," he said, "but do we know there

were three? Are we able to prove that? There are many good things that go on like that at this time of year," said Hardin.

Another event celebrated in many churches is Easter, but the pastor views that as he views Christmas, and calls it "the same thing" as Christmas. "We do not know the day He (Jesus) died," however Hardin said, in Matthew, chapter 26, verse 26, it says "take bread."

The death of Jesus is commemorated at the Church of Christ. "The first day of the week we remember His death," he said. Sunday's service begins at 10:30 a.m. with a few announcements, said the preacher, then the congregation sings together, followed by remembering the Lord's Supper, through the distribution of unleavened bread and the fruit of the vine. There is a short scripture reading, a sermon and a song. Bible Study

precedes the Worship Service.

Returning to an explanation of the tenants of his church, Hardin said that the beliefs "come straight from the Bible." There are three main parts to the religion, he said. Adult Christians must believe in the words of the New Testament and in Jesus, he said. They must repent of their sins and confess their faith.

Hardin did not specify the exact age at which a person can become a Christian, stressing, "the biggest factor is if they realize they have done wrong. God has a set of standards...infants can't do wrong."

Teenagers are able to discern right from wrong, he said, and he tries to show them the Bible, as a way of helping them to cement their beliefs.

Confusion about God stems from mankind, said the preacher, "Man is very

good at messing things up. Salvation is very plain."

Hardin lives his life with the same philosophy he espouses to his congregation. "If we're lucky, we'll be here 70, 80 or 90 years," he said. "That's the time we have. We have one shot to make things right before we stand before God. I don't want to gamble with my eternity."

In addition to the twice-a-week Bible study classes, and the Sunday morning worship services, about a month ago Hardin began a half-hour radio program on WOBL, 1320 AM, which is broadcast Sunday mornings from 8 to 8:30, in which he preaches the message of the Bible. In the future, the preacher said, he may open the program to callers with questions, and he encourages feedback.

Prior to the radio programs, the church had been offering a correspondence course on the Bible. People who send in their names and addresses receive the course by mail at no charge, and with no obligation. The response to flyers advertising the course, "proved to us that people are still interested in the Bible," said Hardin, adding that he does not think that things change very much. "You can go back thousands of years and man's problems are still the same," he said.

Keeping up with today's fast track, the church also has its own website which Hardin set up and which is just a click away from information about The North Ridgeville Church of Christ, including some about the church's history. Hardin and his wife, Shelly, live in Elyria and are expecting their first child in April.

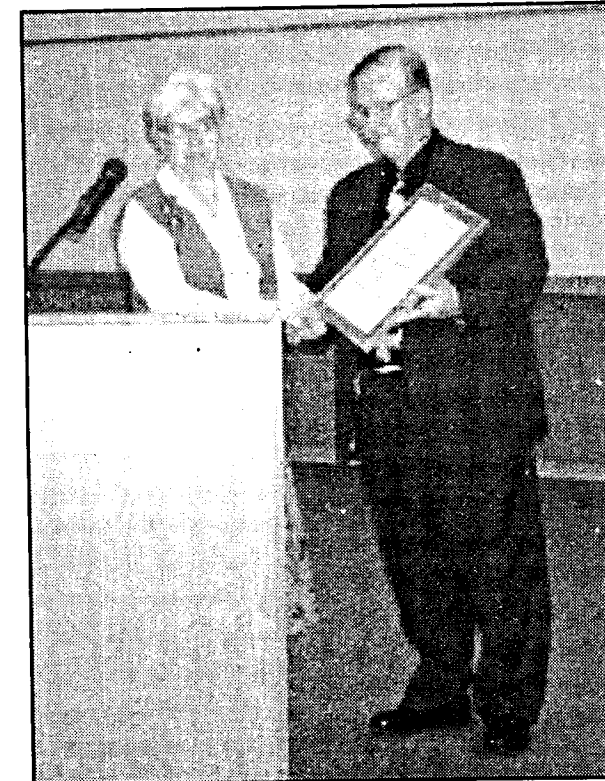

YOUR DENTAL HEALTH

 A Better Night's Sleep
 From Your Dentist?

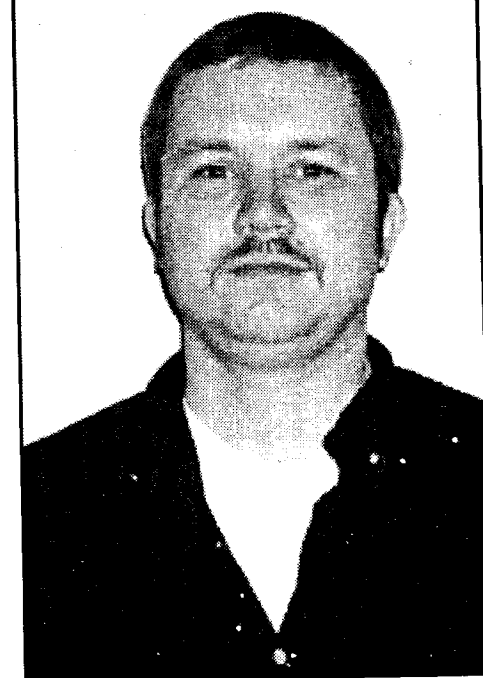


It is estimated that more than 80 million people in North America snore while sleeping. Left untreated, snoring creates problems for more than just the snorer. Snoring is often due to a relaxation of the muscles and soft tissue in the throat during sleep which result in a smaller airway. This decrease in the airway space increases the speed of air flowing through the airway during breathing. The increase in the speed of air through the constricted space cause soft tissues like the soft palate and the uvula to vibrate. These vibrations result in "noisy breathing" or generally referred to as snoring. Many other factors can contribute to snoring such as excess body weight or use of sedatives.

While many remedies exist for eliminating snoring problems, not all are effective. Surgical techniques to remove impairing structures usually result in a 20-40% success rate. Another technique which seems to be highly effective is an appliance which is worn at night and fabricated by your dentist. These appliances gently position the lower jaw into a forward position by means of special connectors. With the lower jaw in a slightly forward position, the airway stays open and prevents snoring in 70-100% of reported cases. Of course, these appliances are not for everyone. Individuals without any teeth may not be able to wear an appliance of this nature. These appliances are also not indicated for individuals with Obstructive Sleep Apnea (OSA). OSA is a serious medical condition in which complete blockage of the airway space occurs for more than 10 seconds. If Obstructive Sleep Apnea is suspected, your dentist may refer you to a sleep specialist. If snoring is a problem for you or someone in your family, check with your dentist to see how they can help you resolve this situation. ney's fees," said Zagrans.

The Law Director also stated that when Phillips filed a complaint against North Ridgeville Citizens for Equal Votes, co-chairs Father Thomas Hyland, June Yost, Bob Schmitt, Mayor Deanna Hill and Robin Hrabik traveled to Columbus, only to learn that while they were en route, Phillips had withdrawn the complaint.

During the lobby Phillips fired back at Zagrans, noting that the Law Director had billed the city for 88 hours of work. The attorney said that Zagrans had submitted a bill in September for \$1,500 and one in October for \$1,500, "with no hours and no itemization."

Phillips insisted, "I did not bill the city for drive time."

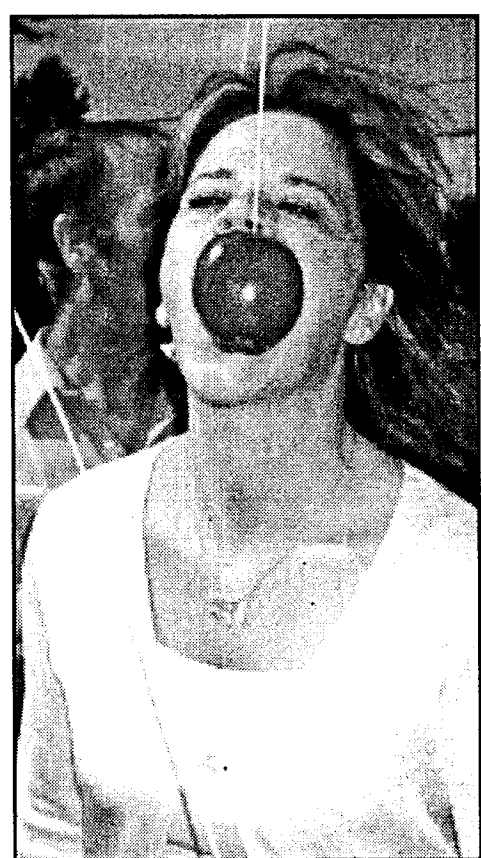

Northern bust of Mary Jane

Police in North Olmsted requested that an officer from North Ridgeville meet them to serve a warrant on a juvenile who lives on Sugar Ridge Rd. The North Ridgeville cop accompanied three officers to the residence where they made contact with the residents of the apartment.

When the door opened, an extremely strong odor of marijuana came from inside the apartment. Two of the North Olmsted officers took the individual they were looking for into custody while their other officer helped the Ridgeville officer as they spoke with another resident and gained entry to the apartment. They observed eight people sitting around in one room.

The officers spoke with Miles Shipman, who was holding his six-month-old baby and his approximately four-year-old son behind him. After being advised that there was an odor of marijuana, Shipman handed the North Ridgeville officer a cellophane baggie containing the contraband.

The officers then walked through the apartment and found two other subjects located in a bedroom with the lights off at the back of the apartment. Police spoke with one of the subjects, Michael Miller, whose eyes were red and glassy. His reactions also appeared to be slow and, when he

was asked questions, he needed the questions repeated. Like Shipman, Miller handed over a cellophane baggie containing marijuana.

After checking through LEADS, the officers learned that Miller had an existing through L.C.S.O. Miller was then taken into custody. Officers also found a ceramic smoking pipe, which Shipman admitted to owning. Another large ceramic smoking apparatus with four clear tubes extending from it was also found by officers, but a juvenile in the group claimed to owning it. Both devices had marijuana residue in them.

Shipman was cited for possession of marijuana and for possession of paraphernalia. He was released. Miller was cited for possession of marijuana and released to L.C.S.O. Both were given a court date of Nov. 29. The juvenile is being referred to Juvenile Court for possession of paraphernalia.

Mary Jane gets around

An officer who was stationed on St. Rt. 10 near the Ohio Turnpike westbound entrance ramp observed a vehicle traveling eastbound on State Route 10 was traveling at a high rate of speed shortly on Nov. 20.

The car was traveling 80 mph, 15 mph over the posted speed limit.

The officer asked the 17-year-old male driver for his driver's license and proof of

insurance, but he gave the officer a temporary driver's license that had expired on Nov. 13. The 18-year-old passenger, Daniel Friedl, gave the officer his driver's license, which was valid.

The officer smelled a faint odor of burnt marijuana inside the car while questioning the driver about how fast he was going and if his parents knew where he was. Setting those questions aside, the officer raised another question higher - is there any marijuana in the vehicle?

No? After requesting the driver to step out of the vehicle, the officer conducted a pat-down search. He then placed the 17-year-old in the cruiser after finding no contraband in his search. The officer did a pat-down search of Friedl, but no contraband surfaced on him either.

The officer asked the inevitable question once again, but this time Friedl stated that there was a plastic bag containing marijuana between the passenger seat and center console and that there was more marijuana on the floor of the vehicle on the passenger side near the door. He also admitted that the marijuana was his and that he was trying to conceal it. Based upon that, Friedl was

taken into custody and placed in the back of the cruiser.

The officer found the marijuana, a total of 6.2 grams, in the exact places Friedl had described.

The mother of the 17-year-old was contacted and she advised police that her son had permission to be out with Friedl.

The 17-year-old was cited in the Lorain County Juvenile Court for speeding and Friedl was cited into North Ridgeville Mayor's Court for possession of marijuana.

Couldn't call the police

A man had some difficulty in calling police, so he had to swing by the police station on Nov. 20 to let officers know that his phone was missing.

Parked in front of the Giant Eagle on Center Ridge near Pitts Rd. with his mother, he had apparently placed his cellular telephone on the roof of his mother's vehicle before they drove out of the parking lot.

Two hours after they had left, he returned to the parking in attempts to locate the cellular telephone, but was unable to find it and the components that were with it.

There are currently no suspects in the case.

stove had lost control and had begun in the chimney. The owner stated that the damper on the stove had been removed because it was melted by the previous owner.

The fire department advised the current owner that it was not safe to use the stove until it was repaired or replaced.

Dust bunnies

A resident of a house on Main Ave. called the fire department to report that there were some odd noises and smelled something strange coming from the heater on Nov. 21.

The fire department arrived shortly before 2:30 a.m. to check the heater and they also tested for carbon monoxide with two meters.

Apparently, the filters needed cleaning and the heater needs a regular check-up with a scorching doctor.

What a gas!

There was a strange smell coming from a garage on Hickory Trail in the morning of Nov. 18 that just turned out to be a gasoline spill.

A lawn mower had some difficulty holding its own and firefighters arrived at 9:13 a.m. to find that about a half gallon of gasoline had been dropped on the concrete floor. They opened the garage door to vent it and then used an absorbent to clean up the gasoline spill.

Signs to save lives

There's an old joke about how to find a burning home in a rural area. When the fire chief asks what the address is, the people respond with, "Just drive down the road and you'll see the smoke."

But to the firefighters in North Ridgeville finding homes during an emergency is not a joking matter. The fire departments in the area, including North Ridgeville's, has come up with a solution to being able to find a home in the event of an emergency - they have begun selling reflective metal plates that have house numbers posted on the sides.

These plates could be the difference between life and death. Otherwise fire, police, and paramedic units may have to drive past the house two or three times and, by then, it could be too late.

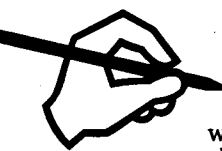

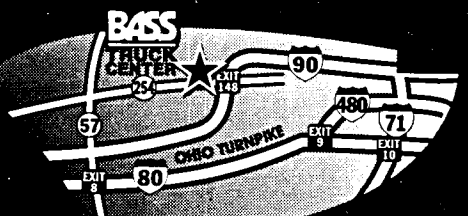
