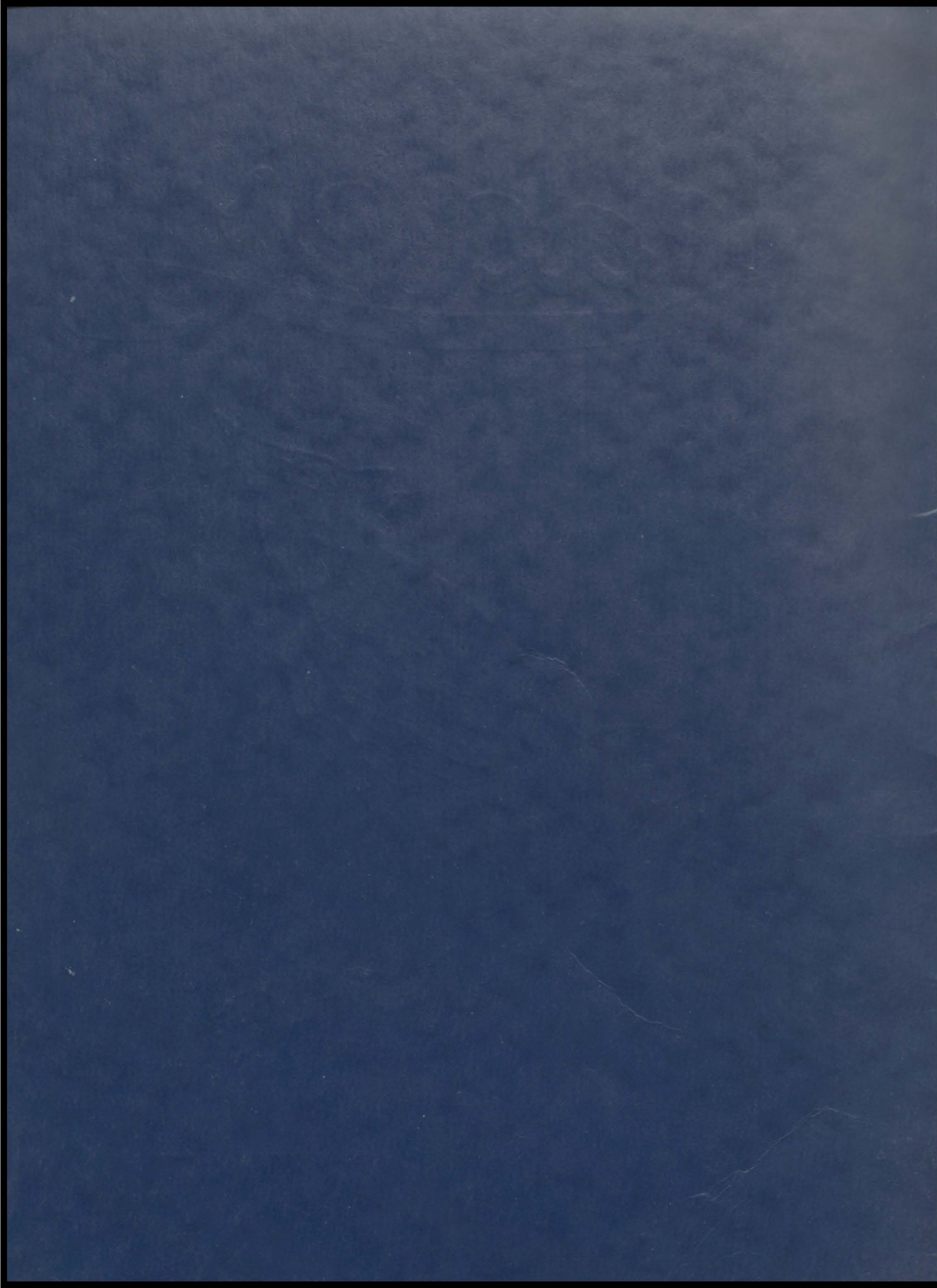

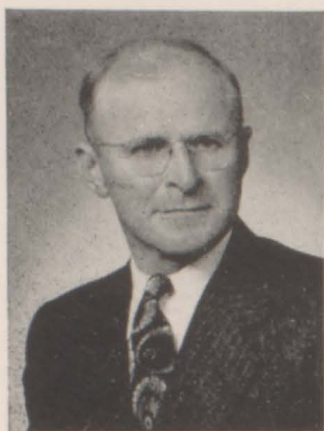

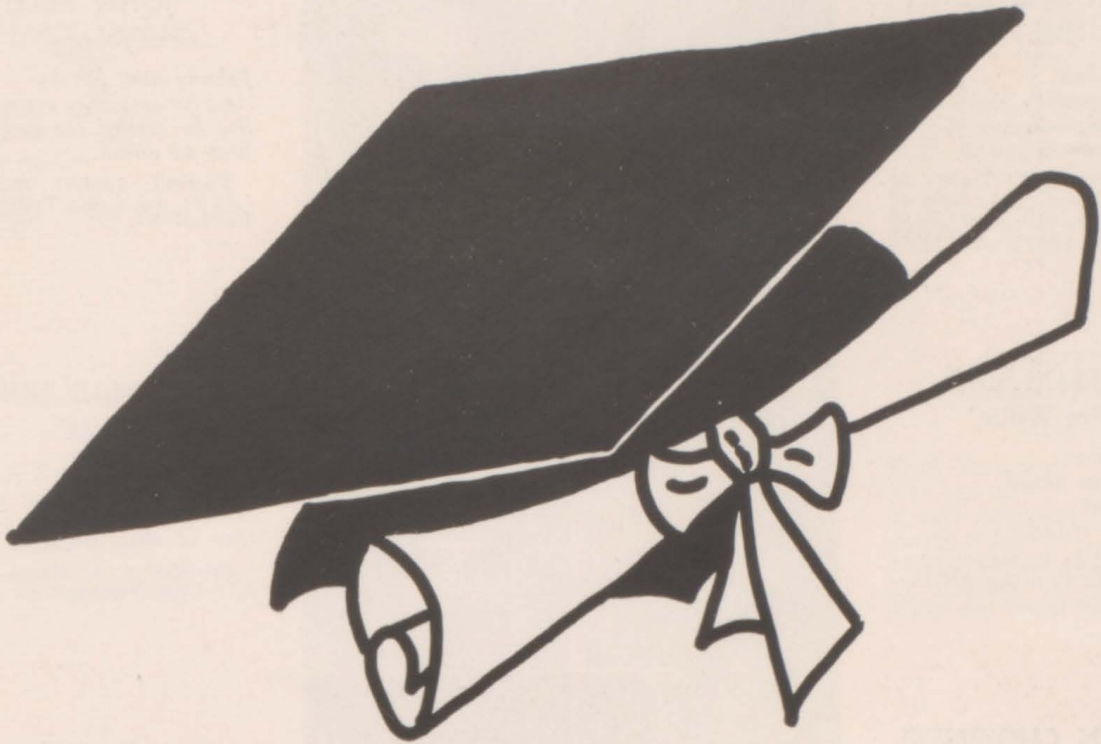

They were: Pat Edwards, Ken Wingate, David Reed, Joe Blazina, Mildred Gjurasin, Marilyn Urig, Bobbie Fedor, Rita Mae Bring, Don Kriebel, Anne White, Maryann Sauvey, Shirley Sekerek, Bill Biro, Norman Klingshirn and Bruce O'Neil. This was the year when the freshmen really started working to achieve sufficient funds to go to Washington, by holding many raffles and magazine sales. The officers for the freshman year were: Nancy Barr, President; Janice Crandall, Vice President; Jim Gornall, Secretary; Norman Klingshirn, Treasurer.

The sophomore year opened with thirty-four students including the newcomers, Eileen Schmidt and Rae Van Nuys, but lost three students, Nancy Barr, Janice Crandall, and Donna Cummings. In this year the officers were: Sonya Sherban, President; Bob Barnhart, Secretary; and John Belu, Treasurer. Bake and magazine sales were some of the activities in which the students made most of their money this year.

Clarice Light, Dorothy Little, Don Minnich, Shirley Schaeffer, and Robert Jones left Brookside after their junior year. The enrollment for the year 1952 was thirty-three. On May 10th we held the Junior

1952 CHAMPS

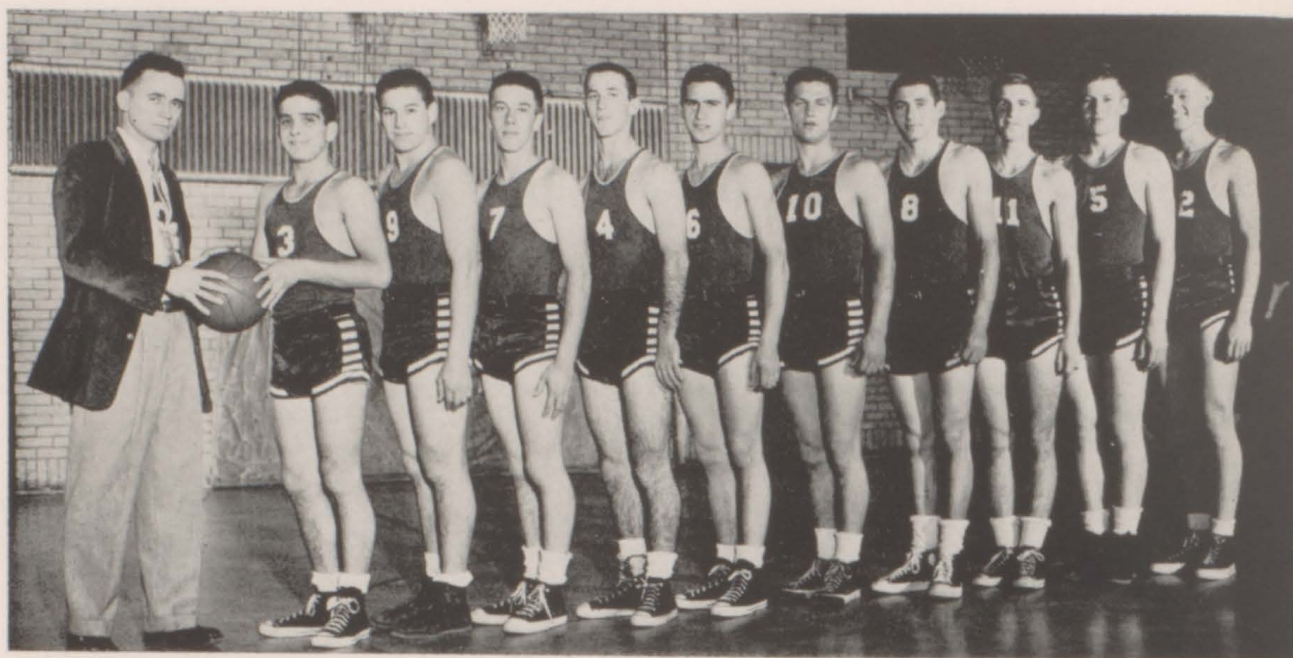
