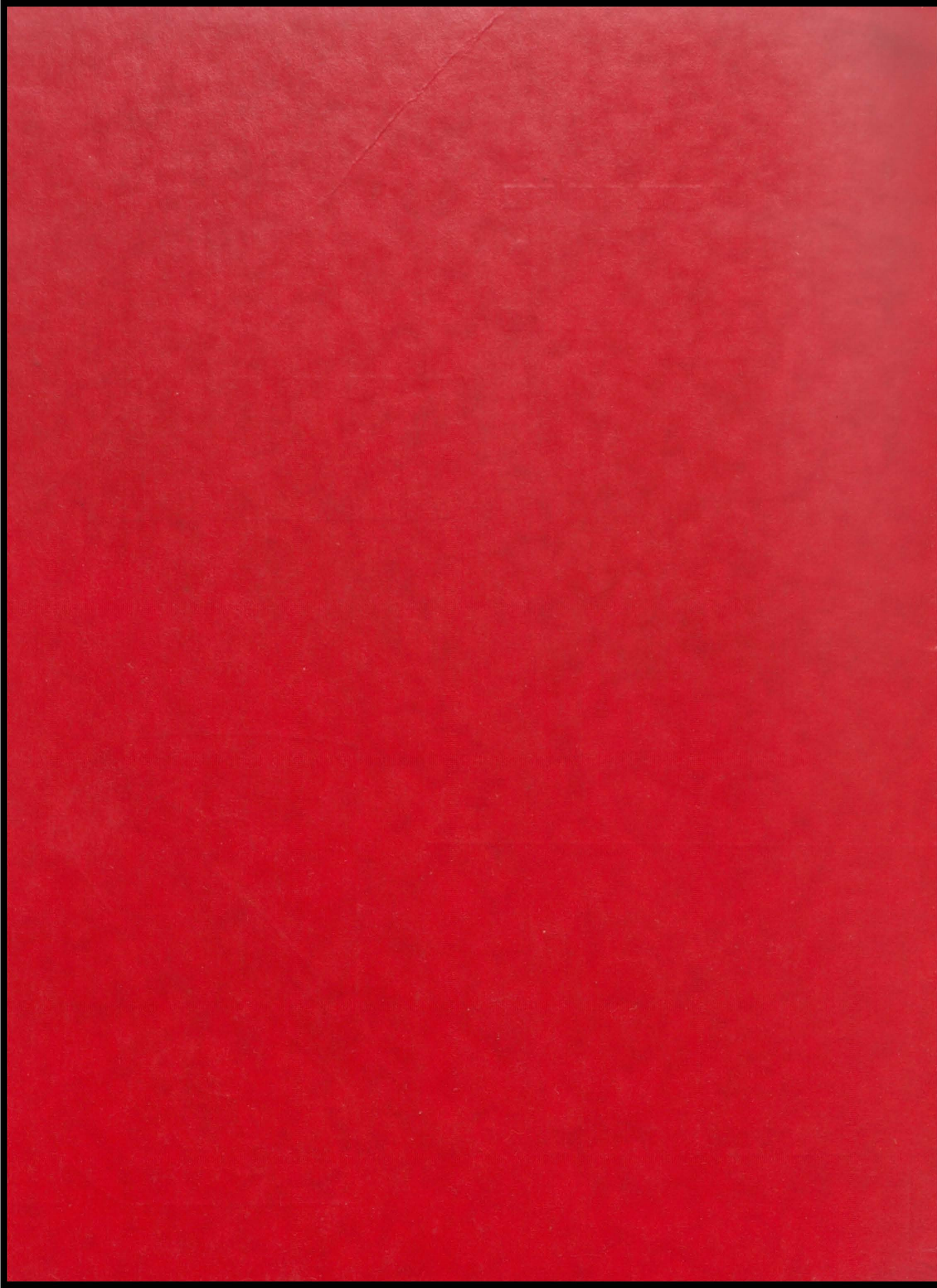

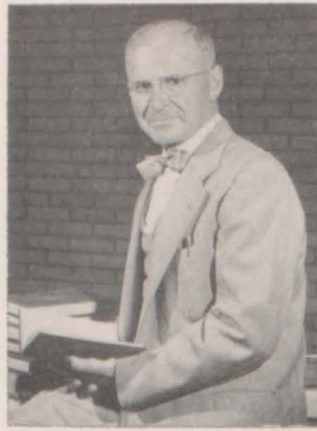
Dedication
